

"Gloria Dei" is Latin for "The Glory of God." We began as a mission in the western part of Des Moines with the

purchase of nine acres of land in Urbandale in December 1960. Four years later, the original eight families organized their efforts and built the church where 101 worshippers were present at the first worship service.

Due to the increased worship attendance throughout the years, many changes have occurred. More worship services have been added along with building a new Sanctuary, offices, Family Life Center, center



wing and east wing and more parking spaces. Currently, we have five weekend services with an average attendance of more than 1,000.

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body.
