Lessons from Mark

In today's message, we will look at two different accounts in Mark, which teach us a lot about how to deal with challenges.

The first revolves around a causal walk with Jesus and the disciples gathering grain in a field. Not an issue on most days; however, since it was the Sabbath, the Pharisees aggressively disputed their simple meal plan.

The second hinges upon a man's hand being completely restored in front of lots of people in the synagogue. Jesus singles out the man and asks him to "stand up in front of everyone." The Pharisee once again demanded an explanation of Jesus working on the Sabbath.

Now let's look at these two accounts more closely: The disciples were hungry. The man needed healing. Jesus leaned *toward* both needs, while the Pharisees leaned *against* Jesus' endeavors. The divine ramifications of the disciples being fed or a man being healed was of little consequence to these Pharisaical law-keepers for keeping the law was more important than helping people.



It's also interesting to note Jesus' response to both of their assaults: He silenced them by asking a heavenly question in the midst of their self-appointed righteous indignation.

Have you never read?

Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil...?

Of course, Jesus' deafening questions are followed by a declaration of the truth that the Sabbath was indeed created to restore the diminished, revitalize the weary and strengthen the weak. In fact, Jesus did not break the Sabbath, he was fulfilling it.

Interesting twist, don't you think? Are there areas of your life, where you feel drained, tired, exhausted? And you keep on trying, working harder, but you land on the same lonely road? Or are there times when you serve and love the people around you, and your neighbor accusingly says, "You should not be helping those people because..."

Take heart, you are not alone, Jesus dealt with both extremes in these two accounts. So, let's hit the pause button from life's busyness and listen to what the Lord is teaching us in Mark.

Weekly Bible reading - Mark 2:23-28; 3:4-6 (NIV)

One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and as his disciples walked along, they began to pick some heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?"

He answered, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need? In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he also gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath." Then Jesus asked them, "Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they remained silent. He looked around at them in anger and, deeply distressed at their stubborn hearts, said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was completely restored. Then the Pharisees went out and began to plot with the Herodians how they might kill Jesus.
