### Getting past your Jordan

Joshua told the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." Joshua 3:5

The years in the wilderness were filled with wrath and death, but those times have now expired—the children of Israel are poised to enter into Canaan. They are ready to claim their inheritance in the land of promise. However, before they can enter Canaan, they must first get past one final, major obstacle—the rapidly flooding Jordan River.

With boldness and faith Joshua gives the order to the priests, "When you reach the edge of the Jordan's water, go and stand in the river." In other words, the priests had to put their feet into the raging river. He then orders the entire nation to break camp, which is no small undertaking. If Joshua has misinterpreted God's command or God changes his mind—Joshua will have made an incredible mistake.

The tension continues, Joshua commanded the people to follow the priests into the river! Can you feel the suspense? Joshua, the priests, the people remembering their wilderness experience while looking at the river rushing before them. Do we stay, or do we go? This is not only a step of faith that the waters will not harm them, but also a forward motion of leaving their 40-year wilderness routine behind them. The promised land was near, but the risks were high if they put their feet in the river. There was no way they could cross this river on their own! They needed supernatural help.

As we read the story, we see the happy ending, but they did not. They were required to believe the promise of God by stepping out in faith. It was not easy, it took plenty of courage for them to step out on God's promises.

Similarly in our lives, we will all be called to step out in faith in some area of life—to put our feet in the water, following God's lead, leaving behind the familiar while reaching toward God's calling. At that point, we need to fully realize that God's promises are larger than our Jordans and that we need supernatural help to take faith's first step.

# Missionary to speak at Gloria Dei

### Saturday evening, August 4 in the Family Life Center (after worship)

Cristian Santiago, a man of passion and commitment to reach out to children in

need in the Dominican Republic through the development and expansion of the Lighthouse School in the Los Alcarrizos community will speak at Gloria Dei.

Last February, Bill Clark and other members saw and contributed to the work firsthand when they dedicated the newly constructed "Project 52 Treye Blythe Gymnasium" on the school grounds.

"Continuing to work with Cristian and his efforts will help so many children," says Bill. "Since Cristian is at ground level, he understands the dynamics of the community.

Therefore, by supporting his efforts, we can make an impact on a community that is in need, thus fulfilling the great commission."

The community of Los Alcarrizos has a growing population of more than 300,000 people, most of whom live in slums with little infrastructure and few schools. Thousands of children receive no education because of limited space in the few public schools that do exist. To address this, Careforce International has partnered with Juventud para Cristo (YFC) in the development and expansion of the Lighthouse School, constructing a primary and secondary school and a training center. Today the school has over 1,150 students in pre-school to grade 12 receiving a Christian education. The vocational training center currently teaches valuable skills to nearly 200 students in such areas as English, business management, computers, and other technical fields. To date, more than 3,000 people have benefited from this initiative.

So, please mark your calendar to attend Cristian's presentation.

# A mountaintop experience among the poorest of the poor

Thank you to everyone who supported the trip by prayers, financial support, and donating quilts, blankets and Bibles. Everyone should take a mission trip one time in their life! I can write a story about it, take pictures and even videotape it but until you wear it on your skin, I cannot do justice to the experience of serving others.

This was my eighth trip to Honduras to serve on a mission trip. Every trip is a bit different but they all are the same in the honor and privilege it is serve the least of these. Poverty is worldwide, and the need is great.

Through these trips, I have experienced the effects of poverty. One of the basic challenges of poverty is the availability of water. The average American uses 300

gallons of water per day. If you had to carry that water from a water source one mile away with a five-gallon bucket, it would take you eight hours each day and weigh more than 2,500 pounds! Your choice for water would then be to buy it or to collect it when it rains.

This year we served Monday and Tuesday in the Colonia of Nueva Capital in Northwest Tegucigalpa. The church was literally on top of a mountain. The road leading to the

church was full of ruts scattered with large rocks. The unemployment rate in Tegucigalpa is around 42 percent; in Nueva Capital it's more than 80 percent. Since the city is on top of a mountain with no water source, all the water must be brought in by truck. In addition, there is no sewer service and crime rates are very high. A local missionary said that Nueva Capital is the poorest of the

poor in Honduras. However, for what the Hondurans lack in basic needs, they show an amazing faith in their personal lives. When we talk about Jesus during the medical, dental and optical brigades, we often learn and see stronger faith in the Hondurans than we see in ourselves.

It seems every year one person sticks out in my mind. This year, Antonia, a 66-year-old woman who has

> diabetes and high blood pressure, captured my attention. After we visited about her family, I asked her about her faith. She told me that she is a good person and thinks she might go to heaven but she doesn't know. I asked her if she knew about the promise God made when he sent his Jesus to die for our sins. She responded with a confused look. I asked if

she would like to hear the story of

Jesus Christ and she nodded yes. After we shared, she said she would like to recommit her life to Jesus Christ. We prayed the sinners prayer with her as well as praying for her and her family. After we prayed, Antonia said she felt a presence come over her and a change inside. We wrote Antonia's name in a Bible, which she will receive from the local pastor on Sunday. My visit with Antonia was my mountaintop experience for 2012!

### Weekly Bible reading - Joshua 3:1-4, 6 and 14-16 (NIV)

Early in the morning Joshua and all the Israelites set out from Shittim and went to the Jordan, where they camped before crossing over. After three days the officers went throughout the camp, giving orders to the people: "When you see the ark of the covenant of the Lord your God, and the priests, who are Levites, carrying it, you are to move out from your positions and follow it. Then you will know which way to go, since you have never been this way before. But keep a distance of about a thousand yards[a] between you and the ark; do not go near it.

Joshua said to the priests, "Take up the ark of the covenant and pass on ahead of the people." So they took it up and went ahead of them.

So when the people broke camp to cross the Jordan, the priests carrying the ark of the covenant went ahead of them. Now the Jordan is at flood stage all during harvest. Yet as soon as the priests who carried the ark reached the Jordan and their feet touched the water's edge, the water from upstream stopped flowing.
