Building up faith/tearing down walls

Last week, we witnessed the Israelites miraculous crossing to the Promised Land via the dry



Jordan River. After this amazing incident, God instructed Joshua to command twelve men to each pick up a stone and place them together as a memorial to show all generations God's mighty act. Soon echoes of Israelites' phenomenon and the God who rescued them

reverberated throughout the Promised Land and men feared.

There's been a major shift, a complete reversal in the hearts of the Israelites and the inhabitants of Jericho. Instead of God's chosen people being afraid, the inhabitants of Jericho were running from the Israelites! Fear was so prevalent that even the strong city of Jericho was on lock-down. Quite a turn of events from the time when the spies secretly visited and hid in Jericho, don't you think?

Soon the Lord gave Joshua specific instructions on how the priests and the armed men were to circle the city for six days and then on the seventh day, the people were to "Shout! For the Lord has given you the city! The city and all that is in it are to be devoted to the Lord."

And as we know, the wall collapsed, quickly and completely. Miraculously smashed. Gone. Destroyed. One minute strong, the next second destroyed. A few months ago, this wall represented a major obstacle and its inhabitants caused trepidation and fear to Israel, but now their stronghold is shattered.

In Ephesians, we read about another stronghold that was completely torn down through the body of Christ on the cross.

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. Ephesians 2:14-18

Through the blood of Christ, the wall that once separated us has been destroyed. We are now ushered into the presence of God. All strongholds in life have been demolished. Insecurity, fear, depression, lack of hope, strife, jealousy, envy and addictions have been taken care of by the blood of Christ.

Sound a little bit too simplistic? Perhaps it is because we all have things in our life that weigh us down. Sometimes those strongholds have lived with us for so long that we think they are normal. And like the inhabitants of Jericho, they are powerful. But what would happen if we truly believed that those strongholds have already been shattered? Would we live differently? Would it change our perspective on the grip they have on our lives? Let's go back in time to the walls of Jericho and see God's heart when facing impenetrable walls.

Additional Information

The increase in total income comes from the increase in general fund giving and preschool tuition. The majority of the reduction of expenses for the year is due to the refinance of the building loans. Since overall income was less than budgeted, expenses were kept low in many areas for cash flow purposes. Work from Ugandan artist can be purchased

Gloria Dei's Toolshoppe will be selling artwork created by artist Godfrey Kalungi. Godfrey is a 28-year-old artist in Uganda, Africa who hand paints beautiful batiks.

Starting with the cloth, Godrey uses a process of pouring wax on the cloth to dry, outlining the design, painting his creation, and laying the batik out to dry in the warm African sun. He has had no formal training and his designs come from things that inspire him. Here are some highlights on Godfrey:

- Godfrey is one of nine children.
- He works to sell his art to support his younger siblings as they go through school because his parents are too old to help.
- Godfrey receives less than \$4 per piece in Uganda, so this presents challenges in bringing in enough income to help his family. The Toolshoppe will be selling them for \$25. All of the proceeds from the sale of the batiks go directly back to Godfrey to help him buy more supplies and support his family.

Emily Raecker and the Shining City Foundation are working to help Godfrey gain more profit through new markets in the United States. Godfrey is a Christian man who is very grateful that his prayers for an expanded market have been answered. So, please stop in the Toolshoppe this weekend to see these beautiful pieces of art.

Updates: This ministry seeks to assist members of the retirement and near retirement age group to participate in the mission of the church, bringing people to Christ for the first time and for a lifetime. Four ministry



action teams plan programs and events with opportunities for fellowship, service, growth and learning, and travel. Plans for the fall include mentoring of new members of the church and a trip to Branson, Mo. from Nov. 7-10.

Sunday, August 12 at 5 p.m. We will be having a potluck with a presentation concerning how to select an individual health insurance policy by Claus Bunz, a retired lawyer and Gloria Dei member.

What to bring: People with names from A to M bring a main dish or vegetable; people with names from T-Z bring a dessert.

Overview of presentation: Medicare hospital insurance (Medicare Part A); Medicare medical insurance (Medicare Part B); Medicare Supplement Insurance to cover the gaps in Medicare resulting from deductibles, coinsurance, excess charges and non-covered items; Medicare prescription drug coverage (Medicare Part D); and Part D annual enrollment procedures. The presentation will last approximately 30 to 45 minutes and will be followed by a question and answer period. While this presentation is being sponsored by the Senior Adult Ministry, all interested persons are welcome to attend. The presentation will be made by trained Senior Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) Volunteer Counselors who operate under the auspices of the Iowa Division of Insurance.

During the fiscal year July1, 2010-June 30, 2011, Iowa's SHIIP saved clients \$3,841,714.00, made 44,069 individual contacts and rendered 33,858 hours of volunteer service. In that time period, there were 340 Iowa SHIIP volunteer counselors, 108 sponsor coordinators and 108 sponsor sites. SHIIP volunteer services are available in 89 Iowa counties.
