

Foundational Truths - Grace

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV)

In most garage sales there is always a table of assorted items. The items usually consist of old, unwanted, and outdated household wares along with old and sometimes tattered clothing. You sort through the myriad of items to find one that you cannot live without. Of course, your friends disagree about its inherent value by commenting that it is a piece of junk. But you see its worth and proudly take it home.



In many regards, we are similar to the unwanted items at a garage sale. We are tattered, stained, broken, irrelevant, out-of-date,

and yet God, in his grace and mercy, reached out and rescued us from all the worldly elements to usher us into a new home.

It wasn't so long ago that you were mired in that old stagnant life of sin. You let the world, which doesn't know the first thing about living, tell you how to live. You filled your lungs with polluted unbelief, and then exhaled disobedience. We all did it, all of us doing what we felt like doing, when we felt like doing it, all of us in the same boat. It's a wonder God didn't lose his temper and do away with the whole lot of us. Instead, immense in mercy and with an incredible love, he embraced us. He took our sin-dead lives and made us alive in Christ. He did all this on his own, with no help from us! Then he picked us up and set us down in highest heaven in company with Jesus, our Messiah. Ephesians 2:1-6 (Message Bible)

Aurora Campus Improvements Updates

We are gearing up for a summer full of change as we proceed with the Aurora Campus Improvements Plan. We are



thankful for the generosity of our congregation as they continue to contribute to this plan. To date, we have received \$553,497 in pledges and have received the approval at the Annual Meeting for a line of credit based on the pledges received.

With all those details finalized, the Facilities MAT, Greg Cushing, member; Brandon Simpson, Facilities Manager, Bill Jesse, Executive

Director; and Tim Olson, Architect have been busy creating a process and a timeline to complete the Aurora Campus Improvements projects.

"We are very excited to begin the work," said Bill Jesse. "We feel privileged to take care of this beautiful facility that God has given to us. God is at work here, and it's all about glorifying him."

In all their planning, the Facility MAT has purposely set out to ensure that there is minimum interruption to the church during the summer months. At times, certain entrances or hallways may not always be accessible, but worship in both locations as well as other ministry offerings should be available. The following, further describes the scope of the projects.

Building maintenance project overview

This portion of the plan is directed by the architect, Tim Olson, Big Creek Design Group, and includes the following projects:

Sanctuary Pitched Roof- Asphalt shingles on the pitched roof

EIFS – Replace the EIFS material with brick that matches our current facility

Flat roof – To replace the flat roof with new roofing material

Tuck-pointing – This includes masonry cleaning and tuck pointing

On June 15, the Facility MAT met with Tim Olson, to review the plans and to establish the tentative work schedule; the sending, receiving and granting of bids by July 17; a start date by August 1; and a projected completion date by Sept. 28.

- 7/17/12 Bids received
- 7/17/12 Qualify low bids, award projects
- 7/19/12 Site coordination of successful contractor bids
- 8/1/12 Projected construction start for asphalt shingles on the pitched Sanctuary roof
- 8/1/12 Projected construction start for EIFS removal and masonry replacement on the FLC and the L wing
- 8/24/12 Projected construction start for the flat Sanctuary roof
- 9/4/12 Projected construction start for the tuck pointing project

Remodeling projects overview

Simultaneously, remodeling projects will begin as soon as projects are bid and approved with the targeted completion date of our fall launch on Sept. 8-9. All of these projects will be directed by the Facility MAT.

FLC Upgrades – Mounting speakers from the ceiling and adding two additional screens



Tiny Treasures' Youth Mission Trip

We are excited to find out what God has planned for us to do as we serve him with our hands and feet. Our group of 23 will be traveling to Port Jervis, New York to join forces with 400 other teens and adults from the United States and possibly Canada. We will travel in three 15-passenger vans, driving 20 hours each way while taking sleeping gear and tools that will help us complete the projects that we will be assigned to do.

We will break into work crews of six people (none of which we have met before) to begin work on a house in the community. As a group, we will complete work on approximately 75 different houses in the week. Some of the projects our team will be working on include painting an entire house, constructing a wheelchair ramp, re-building a porch, winterizing homes, re-roofing a house or other projects that the residents will need to have done.

We will stay at a local school (hopefully air conditioned) while at the camp. Air mattresses, sleeping bags and/or cots will be our bedding for the week as we share room accommodations with another group or two that we have joined forces with. Each day we pack our lunches, make sure our tools are ready and prepare for the work that we will be doing.

Our group would like to thank you for your prayers, financial support and encouraging words. We are ready to go and "be Jesus with skin on" to those in the Port Jervis community. One of the cool things that happens after these trips is the change of perspective our group has. We don't leave the mission in Port Jervis, we bring it back with us so we can live it out here in our own community and church.


