Foundational Truths - Holy Trinity

30 Hour Famine

Friday, June 8 and Saturday, June 9 - Out of a deep desire to bring the reality of children living in other cultures to our youth, ministry partner Kim Phillips has headed up the 30 Hour Famine at Gloria Dei for eight years, raising awareness as well as more than \$72,500 to help fight world poverty.

"My heart is to go back to the basics, take away some of the comforts that the youth enjoy daily, so that they will begin to see the plight of those in other countries," says Kim. "It's an



eye-opener for them (and for me) to realize that children in third-world countries do not have what we have at our fingertips. It is exciting to see how the famine is oftentimes a catalyst for how they serve in the future."

The famine began Friday, at 12:30 p.m. when 30 youth, ages 12 and older,

will be in the Narthex and the Family Life Center collecting money to help the children in Kenya, Sudan and Ethiopia. All funds received will be matched (four times) by a governmental grant. Thank you for your support!

Today after worship, the youth

committed to abstain from food for 30 hours. At 6 p.m., they met at church (all personal technology devices are banned) to learn about five different countries through interactive

activities. A Bible study followed highlighting the hardships of children throughout the world. To end the evening, they burned off energy at Sports Flex. They partnered with Joppa Outreach on Saturday morning to clean up the homeless camps in Des Moines and spent the afternoon collecting can goods from the Urbandale neighborhoods for Freedom for Youth Ministries.


