# **Chapter Six: Wanderings**

God has declared his covenant with his people and now it is time to move into the Promise Land. If the people will follow his lead, and do as he commands, the land will be theirs! However, sinful people rarely follow God's lead or listen to his plan, do they? We see the pattern continues when God sends in 12 spies to confirm what he has been telling them. All of the spies agree the land is incredible, but only two trust God to deliver it to them. Because of Israel's lack of faith and rebellion, they will spend 40 years in the wilderness.

Finally a generation passes, and it is time to enter the land. The same conditions apply—follow God's lead and do as he commands. It sounds very simple, but we all know it becomes easier to look at the lower story instead of God's upper story. So, this week let's take a deep look into this section to learn how to avoid the wandering pitfalls that befell the Israelites.

# Our Story....God's Story

It started with a simple concept to help four non-profit organizations and ended with \$2,981 in financial donations and hundreds of physical donations with an estimated value of more than \$1,400.

The idea began to take flight when it was linked with the tailgating party where members could drop off donations in honor of their favorite team. Soon, the idea took form when a ministry partner sketched out an idea, and invited several others to build the huge green displays.

After the first weekend, one of our staff members gasped with amazement when she saw the response of the congregation. After the second weekend the totals escalated:

\$1, 492 for Urbandale Food Pantry

\$1,064 for Joppa Outreach

\$400 ESL gift cards

\$25 Urbandale Food Pantry gift card

564 food items

14 sleeping bags and blankets

4 tents

9 boxes of diapers

- 14 children items, formula, etc.
- 2 flashlight kits
- 4 large containers of batteries
- 6 lg. bags of gently-used clothing
- 1 pair of new boots
- 100 miscellaneous personal items, toothpaste, soap, laundry detergent

"Gloria Dei has always been an extremely generous church. It is part of our story," says Pastor Robarge, Director of Adult Ministry. "In years past, we have supported many organizations outside our church. It is exciting to see people respond to the needs of our community and our world."

And if the story couldn't get better, Jacki Stevens, one of the original founders of Joppa stopped by the office to pick up the church's donations.

"Your phone call made my day," Jacki states. "This morning, we were a bit concerned because we only had less than \$100 in Joppa's checking account. And then to receive your call, was amazing. God is always faithful, isn't he?"

This story is part of Gloria Dei's story...this is God's story and we all get to be a part of God's love and compassion as he reaches those in need.

### **Additional Information**
