The turning point

This week, we will witness a turning point in Jesus' ministry. In the last several weeks, we have seen the Son of God heal, perform miracles, rebuke the Pharisees, teach thousands, calm the sea, and instruct the disciples. This week, Jesus, pointedly asks the disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" The answers were varied, "Some say John the Baptist: other say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." Peter piped up by stating, "You are the Christ."

An interesting question, isn't it? If we were to survey a group of five strangers and ask the same question, more than likely the answers would match some of the disciples' responses. There is even a slim possibility that a stranger may respond, "Jesus, who?"



But of all of the possible answers, Jesus responded to Peter's in Matthew 16:16-19:

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by my Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then he warned his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

After this dialogue, the pivotal point begins when Jesus reveals that he must suffer many things, be rejected by the religious leaders of the day and be killed. If Jesus ended his sentence there, the disciples as well as all of mankind would have had every reason to grieve uncontrollably because all hope would have been gone. However, Jesus continued, "and after three days (I will) rise again."

The greatest addendum to the worst conceivable news. The Son of God **must** suffer, be ridiculed, rejected, and **must** die—but will rise again in three days. But why must he suffer and die? Grab your Bibles and be prepared to search for the reasons why the Son of God had to endure this ultimate trial.

The Wells Bring Hope Project

The youth group has set an audacious goal for this year-to raise \$5,600 to build a well in Niger, Africa. The idea caught fire when Tim Kightlinger, Director of Youth Ministry, asked Danielle Wright, Haley Ness and Emma Griffiths if they would be interested in

helping. They responded quickly with a "count me in" nod and started to develop a plan. They settled on the theme "sacrifice a little, so someone can have a lot,"



because they wanted to encourage sacrificial giving. So instead of eating out or buying candy, they are encouraging each other to put the money in the well.

The project is fairly simple in nature to dig a well deep enough that it reaches the level of pure artesian water that can provide a village of 400-500 people with safe water for more than 30 years. As soon as fresh water becomes a staple in a community, childhood mortality drops by 65 percent and water-borne diseases are virtually eliminated. The

well's benefit also ricochets into the educational realm because girls can now go to school instead of walking miles to a water hole that is usually laced with parasites.

But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men."

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays and Sundays during the services in the Family Life Center.

A note to our guests and visitors: The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, nonalcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.
