# We Need Each Other

Randy Frazee, teaching pastor at Willow Creek Community Church, shares a story about their pet beagle, Lady. The family had decided to take a seven-day vacation but they couldn't bring Lady along. So, they took Lady to an exclusive pet hotel. After returning from their trip, they noticed large clumps of hair clinging to their hands after petting her. When they got home, Randy immediately called their veterinarian. After describing the symptoms, the doctor told him that Lady was stressed by their absence and suggested to spend about two hours with her at home, and her hair would stick once again. Doubtful of the prescription, he was amazed to see that within 15 minutes of being home with the family, Lady's hair stayed on her body.

If a dog starts to fall apart after seven days of being robbed of community, how much more is it true for humans, who are created in the image of God for fellowship? A recent Gallup poll indicates that a third of our population is experiencing frequent feelings of intense loneliness. Those living alone have tripled since 1960. Doctors say loneliness can bring on other diseases. Loneliness is not good!

In last week's sermon, we learned that we were designed for community and created not to be alone. We need other people in our lives!

Surround yourself with good Christian friends! When the Apostle Paul felt lonely in prison, he asked Timothy, Luke, and Mark to come to him. Trying to live the Christian life alone is hard and yet many people journey on that road. I am deeply concerned by how many lonely Christians are church members. People who sneak into their pew just before the service begins, and zip out the door the second it's over. Sometimes we treat the church like a library, rather than a family.

Jesus gave everything for the church. He knew we needed each other, and he designed the church to bring us community! The fact is "Christian individuality" is an oxymoron. Ask any member of a community group if they are "lonely" in their journey, and they will say, "Definitely not." You can't study God's Word together, pray for each other, develop bonds of confidentiality and trust, and not discover the blessings and benefits of a Christian family. Loneliness is cured and support is given by "dipping yourself" in the bonds of fellowship.

I encourage you today to examine your loneliness barometer; if it is high, consider joining a community group and reap the benefits.

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son, purifies us from all sin. I John 1:7



# **Stepping Stones**


## Starts Thursday, Sept. 6 at 6:30 p.m. Register today!
