Winding Curves: Take Your Eyes Off the Road

This week ends our "Signs of Life" sermon series. It is fitting that it ends on the winding curves sign because life is full of unexpected curves, detours, and pitfalls that occasionally cloud the road ahead. This week we will take our eyes off the road and onto the guide, the reference point, our northern star, which helps us to navigate in every situation.

For this God is our God for ever and ever; he will be our guide even to the end.
Psalm 48:14

This week also marks the first day of the Iowa State Fair. In my household, the fair evokes fond memories, except for the year that we joined some of our out-of-town friends. On that hot August day, our group consisted of 10 children ages six and under and five adults. In the midst of grazing through the food lines and browsing at the vendors, we noticed five-year-old Austin was gone. Terror immediately struck our hearts; we quickly hatched a plan where each of us would search different locations before reporting back in 10 minutes. When we returned, Austin was not in hand. As panic rose in each of our hearts, we decided to search one more time before contacting the authorities. Within a few minutes, I spotted Austin strolling casually down the sidewalk. Miffed by his cavalier attitude, I inquired about his detour. "I didn't like where we were, so I decided to explore by myself," he said. Although I was happy to see him, veering from our path was completely inconsiderate—he should have known better.

Knowing better doesn't always fuel our actions, does it? Take, for example, Jonah. When God told Jonah to go to Nineveh, he ran away from the Lord. Jonah immediately charted an alternative plan and jumped on a ship going to another

city. What was Jonah thinking? What was Austin thinking? When we find ourselves diametrically opposed to our present situation, do we just forsake the pilot and crew and head in our own direction? Jonah's curve from God definitely took a turn for the worse when the storms erupted and the crew had to throw this stowaway overboard.

Though I question Jonah's sanity from running from the Lord, I am amazed at Jonah's gut reaction to drowning—he took his eyes off his hopeless situation and gazed on his deliverer's abilities.

"In my distress I called to the LORD, and he answered me. From the depths of the grave I called for help, and you listened to my cry. You hurled me into the deep, into the very heart of the seas, and the currents swirled about me; all your waves and breakers swept over me." Jonah 2:1-3

When basically all hope was lost, Jonah declared that God would and could deliver him. After three days and three nights, Jonah was washed ashore, a bit humbled, but nonetheless delivered.

But you brought my life up from the pit, O Lord my God. Jonah 2:7

When we find ourselves on a winding curve, whether from our own disobedience, like Jonah or my friend Austin, or from life's detours and bumps, we can be assured that God will guide us every mile along the way.

The Lord will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail. Isaiah 58:11




