What is on Your Bucket List?

Thanks to the opening of a new movie starring Jack Nicholson and Morgan Freeman, there is a new catch phrase called "bucket list." It refers to what one wants to accomplish before he or she kicks the bucket. In the movie, the two main characters are given one year to live. They escape from the cancer ward and embark upon a world trip together with a to-do list to accomplish before they die.

This weekend we begin a new series of messages that asks the question, "What's on your bucket list?" In Matthew 16:21, Jesus explains to his disciples that they are now on their way to Jerusalem, where he will be killed. "From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life." Going through the rest of the Gospel, in a sense, we see what is on Jesus' bucket list, the many things he wants to accomplish before he faces the cross.

Over the next few weeks, the question for us is, how does our bucket list compare to that of Jesus? We read in Matthew 16:23 Jesus rebuking Peter when he says; "...you do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men." We must ask ourselves if the items on our lists are things of God or of man. What we will discover is that while it might be thrilling to go skydiving or white-water rafting, the real meaningful activities are the things God wants us to complete before we spend an eternity with him in heaven.

Congregational Vote

The Governing Board has requested a congregational vote on the proposed Strategic Plan. The goal of this process is to engage all members to participate in acceptance or non-acceptance of the Strategic Plan.

The Strategic Plan vote will use a paper-ballot process on the following days:

Saturday, March 1 from 4-8 p.m. or Sunday, March 2 from 7 a.m.-1 p.m.

In order for the Strategic Plan to be accepted by the congregation, the vote will require that 2/3 of those who voted will have voted in favor of the Strategic Plan.

All members 18 years of age by March 1, 2008 are eligible to vote. Voting stations will be located in rooms 130 and 132. Members will sign in and receive a paper ballot. The completed ballot will be placed in a secured container. An eight-member team comprised of members of the Governing Board (2), Elders (2) and parishioners (4) has been established and will oversee the voting process.

Absentee ballots are available by request. A request for an absentee ballot must be received at the church office no later than noon, Central Standard Time, on February 15, 2008. Requests may be made by phone, letter, fax, or e-mail to the attention of Marsha Sly, Administrative Assistant. Absentee ballots returned to the church office by U.S. mail must be postmarked by Monday, February 25, 2008. Absentee ballots may also be placed in the secured ballot container during voting hours, as listed above.

Ballots will be counted immediately following the close of voting on Sunday, March 2, 2008. Results will be posted on the church Web site at 8 a.m. March 3, 2008, barring any technical difficulties, and mailed to all church members by postcard, postmarked on March 3, 2008. Paper ballots will be retained until June 30, 2008.

30-Hour Famine


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Be Seen. Be Heard. Be Hungry

Chaplain Award

At the recent National LCMS-ELCA Military and VA Chaplains conference, Rev. Rich Steinke was awarded the Bronze St. Martin of Tours medal in recognition of 20 years of pastoral care to military service members and their families. He has served as a VA Chaplain in Helena, Mont. and Indianapolis, Ind., and currently

An award in the name of St. Martin of Tours is particularly appropriate for Lutheran chaplains because Martin Luther was named after him. According to tradition, Martin of Tours was a Roman Army officer who encountered a poor beggar shivering in the cold. Martin drew his sword and cut his military cape in two pieces and covered the beggar with one half of the

cape. That night, Christ appeared to Martin in a dream, wearing half the cape. The vision led to Martin's conversion and baptism. Soon the church set a special day in his honor, St. Martin of Tours day celebrated on November 11.

Years later, Hans and Margarethe Luther took their newborn to be baptized on November 11 and named him Martin Luther, in honor of St. Martin of Tours.

Uganda

Editor's note:

On a weekly basis, we will highlight the many mission efforts supported by Gloria Dei. Expect to learn about the people living in a another culture, the church effort that has touched them and ways in which we can support them.

Join us on a year-long mission effort to collect gently-used items. Starting in March, we will collect gently-used items each month to send to churches and orphanages in Uganda. It is our goal to fill 600 boxes. We will reach out to the community as well as our family here at Gloria Dei to support this ministry. The Orphan Grain Train out of Norfolk, Neb. will be our transport.

The Uganda Ministry Action Team suggests collecting the following items each month:

March: Kitchen supplies (towels, utensils, cleaning items).

April: Outside games, toys (bikes, trikes, etc.) and sports equipment.

May: Garden tools and supplies.

June: Bathroom supplies (towels, cleaners, supplies).

- July: Electronic office equipment and musical instruments.
- Aug.: Shoes (especially men's work shoes; children's school shoes and tennis shoes for women).
- Sept.: Children's summer clothes and school supplies.
- **Oct.:** Men's work clothes.
- Nov.: Women's clothes.
- **Dec.:** Infants' clothing and bedding supplies.
- Jan.: Children's toys and musical instruments.
- Feb. Cloth for sewing and power tools.

Large containers will be in the narthex and the Family Life Center for items to be placed. We ask for a gift of \$5 be left with each donation to cover the shipping expense. Matching funds are also available to assist with this expense for every dollar we collect.

In addition, the first Sunday of every month will be called "Un-Dei Sunday," where we will collect new (still in packaging) underwear, socks and undershirts for all ages, sizes and genders.

Weekends at Gloria Dei

Nursery

Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level, access is through the doors in the narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Cry room

Located in the southeast corner of the narthex is a room for parents to take their small children to when they are upset or crying. This room allows full view of the sanctuary and has full audio to hear the service.

Families worship together

With the exception of the 7:45 a.m. service, the first 20 minutes of each worship service is designed for families to worship together. At that point in the service, children and youth will be invited to join their peers in an educational time specifically for them as outlined below.

Grace Place - preschool and elementary children

We offer Grace Place, our weekend educational time, for children ages 3 to fifth grade at three different times: Saturday from 5:50-6:30 p.m.; Sunday from 9:20-10 a.m.; and Sunday from 10:50-11:30 a.m. Children will be invited from worship to attend Grace Place. They will gather outside of worship and leaders will escort them to their classrooms.

Castaway - youth

For our junior high youth in grades 6-8, we have a high-energy educational time, Castaway, in the Youth Center on Sundays at 9:20 and 10:50 a.m.

Senior high and adults

Our senior high youth in grades 9-12 are invited to a study on Sundays from 9-10 a.m. in rooms 134-38. Adults are invited to join us for an in-depth journey using materials from the Lifelight series in rooms 131-33 from 9:20-10:20 a.m.

Communion

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays during the services in the Family Life Center.
