It's a Matter of Focus

Most great photographers have a knack for seeing ordinary things in different ways. They capture the moment by viewing the obvious from different perspective. Whether they see a background shadow, the way light reflects on a subject or the varieties of color, it is their focal point that distinguishes the master from the amateur.

Similarly, everyday we are all faced with ordinarylife situations while living in a fallen world, such as being angry, lost, humiliated, saddened, betrayed and discouraged. We then have a choice, do we allow the problem to define us, or do we change our perspective by changing what we focus on?

In the book of Numbers, twelve men were sent by Moses to the land of Canaan to spy and report on the land and its inhabitants. As the story unfolds, they returned from Canaan after 40 days with some souvenirs, such as grapes, pomegranates and figs. As news spread about the returning spies, the entire Israelite community gathered to hear about their findings.

The twelve men agreed, "We went into the land to which you sent us, and it does flow with milk and honey!" Even though they saw the same view, their perspectives parted ways when ten of the men reported,

"But the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large... The land we explored devours those living in it. All the people we saw there are of great size. We seemed like grasshoppers in our own eyes, and we looked the same to them." Numbers 13:28a, 32b-33b

Meanwhile on the other side of the camp, Caleb and Joshua showed a different focus:

"The land we passed through and explored is exceedingly good. If the Lord is pleased with us, he will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. Only do not rebel against the

Lord. And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will swallow them up. Their protection is gone, but the Lord is with us. Do not be afraid of them." Numbers 14:7a-9

How do twelve men see the same thing and arrive at two different conclusions? The answer is fairly obvious in this Biblical account—Joshua and Caleb focused on God's ability above their own abilities to deal with the circumstances.

Similar to Joshua and Caleb, we too, can focus on God instead of our current predicament. Whether we are faced with a financial setback, a wrong caused by a friend, a physical ailment or just viewing this beautiful Iowa winter, we can be assured that God's perspective is better than our own. After all, his ways are higher than our ways, we just need to focus on him.

Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:2




