God's Willingness to Deliver

Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one. Matthew 6:13

Last week we examined the first part of this verse and concluded that the Lord can help strengthen us so we can withstand the inevitable temptations we face in this fallen world.

No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it. 1 Corinthians 10:13

Today we will examine the latter part of this verse, "deliver us from the evil one." Certainly, God's delivering power from the evil one is seen and felt at every intersection in the Bible. Take Adam, for example: moments after he succumbed to the serpent, God met him in the garden, pledged to eventually redeem not only Adam, but mankind from evil; replaced his self-made clothes of fig leaves with more substantial garments; and provided this fallen man with a new job and new living arrangements. This amazing foundation of deliverance and love is built upon throughout the archives of the Bible. It seems the more helpless man becomes, the deeper the ditch man digs, the more God's power emerges. No darkness or evil can ever stop God from helping man.

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. Psalms 139:7-8

Another hall-of-fame example of God's delivering power is Jonah, a man who disobeyed God's commands and found himself in the midst of a hopeless, dark and slimy situation.

Being swallowed alive by a fish would jolt any man's thoughts, but it did not shake the Lord—he simply appointed the fish to deliver Jonah unto dry land.

But you brought my life up from the pit, O Lord my God. When my life was ebbing away, I remembered you, Lord, and my prayer rose to you. Jonah 2: 6b-7a.

How about other popular deliverance stories: Daniel in the lion's den? Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the burning furnace? David's encounter with Goliath? Peter in the prison? Each time, God heard their cries and rescued them from the evil that surrounded them.

And here is the clincher: God's willingness to help does not depend on us or the difficulty of our circumstances. Nor is God's helping hand dependent on the guilt or innocence of the victims in distress. Adam and Jonah both were rescued after they willfully disobeyed the Lord, while Daniel's predicament was a result of obeying God. The reasons and the depth of despair are inconsequential to the Lord; what matters is God's willingness and ability to help.

He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. Psalm 40:2

As we immerse ourselves in the archives of the scriptures, we see a God that is ever present and ever able to help man. The book of Romans, states, if God is for us, who can be against us? The God who delivered people in the scriptures from seemingly hopeless situations is the same God who is with us today. When we pray "deliver us from evil," we should expect the same helping hand. He is still the Father who is in heaven, whose name is hallowed, who daily sustains us with our daily needs, who forgives us and who is eager to deliver us from the evil one.

Grief Support Groups

GriefShare: Thursday, August 23 from 6:30-8 p.m. GriefShare is a 13-week grief support group for people dealing with the reality and pain of losing a loved one. Each session consists of a video presentation, sharing and prayer time.

Stepping Stones: Thursday, Sept. 6 from 6:30-8 p.m. Stepping Stones, a 6-week grief-support group for young children aimed at providing children a safe place to process their grief. Different mediums, such as play, sensory activities, puppetry and movement exercises will be used to reach children at their level.
