Keep Moving–No Parking

Watching toddlers walk is one of life's simple pleasures. Somehow they understand the concept of balancing weight on their two feet before plunging forward. Much to their chagrin, this forward motion is often plagued by stumbles, cuts, bruises and cries. Stumbling becomes an intricate part of the cycle, as does getting up and moving on two feet. Discouragement is offset by the desire to walk; permanently halting from this process is not an option. In Proverbs 24, a righteous man's walk is portrayed as being as clumsy as a toddler's.

For though a righteous man falls seven times, he rises again, but the wicked are brought down by calamity. Proverbs 24:16

If perfection is the expectation, this Proverbs' man fails miserably. Look at him; he not only stumbles once, but seven times. On the other hand, if getting up from the fall is the hallmark for success, this man wins a gold medal. He never quits-like an Energizer Bunny of sorts. Likewise, God continues to encourage man to walk in his precepts-one step at a time-with the goal of perpetual motion.

And this is love: that we walk in obedience to his commands. As you have heard from the beginning, his command is that you walk in love. 2 John 1:6

Lots of commands are in the Bible: Be thankful. abstain from evil, rejoice, pray without ceasing, stand fast, put off the old, put on the new, work, do not steal, tell the truth, forgive, love, and redeem the time are a few that top the list. God wants us to walk in and toward these truths,

fully realizing our propensity to tumble. At times, our "faith" walk is obstacle free and we move with graceful precision, and at other times obstacles impede our walk and we fall. The question is not if or how many times we fall. It is: Are we going to get back up on our feet and walk again? If we decide to forge ahead, we can hinge on God's ability to help us.

For you have delivered me from death and my feet from stumbling, that I may walk before God is the light of life. Psalm 56:13

Similar to the parents of a toddler, God cheers and encourages each individual step and does not hold our falls against us. He only wants to be our safety net.

Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve my life; you stretch out your hand against the anger of my foes, with your right hand you save me. The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me; your love, O Lord, endures forever-do not abandon the works of your hands. Psalms 138:7-8

We can walk in this life with the assurance that God is for us and not against us. Like a toddler who steadily looks unto his parents' loving grasp, we walk towards God knowing that he goes before, behind, under and above us. All we have to do is to move forward-knowing that he catches us and does not critique our clumsy attempts at walking.
