A Seeking Father

God is searching for us. His eternal radar is circling every crevice of our hearts. He sees us. He sees it all. He sees the times when we throw doubt and fear overboard to walk out on a divine promise. And much to our delight, we discover his promise offers us a solid haven where we can rest.

He also explores the dark caves of our hearts where shame, hate, envy and strife thrive in the solitude of darkness. "No one sees this hidden side," we say to ourselves. And yet, God sees it all and is not surprised at the grime or filth. Rather, he tenderly whispers these words:

"I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty." 2 Corinthians 6:18 (NIV)

We have been found! God has taken the responsibility of being our father, one who protects, guides, supports, instructs, defends and loves our less-than-perfect skeletons of dust.

And even though I am forever thankful for the example that he etched in my life, it does not compare with my heavenly Father who relentlessly purses me with his unfathomable love and mercy.

Honduras Mission Team Update

Honduras is the third poorest country in Latin America and the second poorest country in Central America. Although the government has achieved a degree of economic stability since 2000, it has not improved living conditions or reduced poverty for the country's huge number of poor people. Poverty levels have remained unchanged since 1997. The population is evenly divided between urban and rural areas, but poverty is essentially a rural problem. About 74 percent of the country's poor people, and 86 percent of the extremely poor, live in rural areas.

Next Friday, June 26, a team from Gloria Dei will be traveling to this country to give free medical, dental and optical care to Hondurans as well as sharing the story of Jesus with children and adults. Please keep the team in your prayers.
