Be Fearless

What does it take to be fearless?

In the make-believe world, fearless characters such as Superman, Batman and Spiderman have incredible physical predispositions to dodge bullets, catch falling victims in mid-air and to triumph over the personified villain of the day.

In real life, examples are not as glamorous, but are as noteworthy. Recently, Mike Dillon, a 70-year-old president of Dillon Aero in Scottsdale, Ariz., decided to drop everything to fly his helicopter for 16 hours to rescue people from the ravaging waters caused by Hurricane Katrina. "I saw the catastrophe on TV," he said, "I had the right equipment to help and I could afford to do it, so I did."

Most of us do not have the genetic tendency or the financial reserves to be as fearless as the above heroes. We do, however, have a resource that can help us live life on the fearless edge despite our "human" inclinations.

David, in the book of Psalms declares that in the midst of turbulent days, he will not fear, because he has made the Lord his complete resource.

The LORD is my light and my salvationwhom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life-of whom shall I be afraid?

When evil men advance against me to devour my flesh, when my enemies and my foes attack me, they will stumble and fall.

Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear; though war break out against me, even then will I be confident. Psalm 27:1-3

In the book of Acts, we have witnessed Peter's metamorphous from hiding for fear of the Jews to boldly and insistently proclaiming the name of Jesus Christ to an unpredictable audience. When Peter was released from prison and commanded not to speak about the risen Lord, he responded by going to the source for help:

When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. "Sovereign Lord," they said, "you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them...Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus." Acts 4:24,29,30

If you are like me, there is hope in Peter's example—he took himself out of the equation and used the power-punching, life-sustaining realities of Jesus Christ. In other words, he left his human frailties and relied on a power greater than himself to thwart off the enemy's moves.

For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling; he will hide me in the shelter of his tabernacle and set me high upon a rock. Psalm 27:5

What does it take to be fearless? We need only tap into God, the only source of power, which never weakens even in the midst of the kyptonite, the Jokers, the Dr. Dooms, or the Lex Luthors of the day.


