## Traveling on God's Highways

In the next few weeks, our sermon series, "Signs of Life," will take us to the roadsides of life to examine everyday sights, such as merge, caution, one way, stop, rest area, no parking and winding curves signs. While these signs are vital for traffic flow and safety, their simple commands can prompt us on how God wants us to travel in life. The book of Isaiah declares that God's ways are higher than our ways; therefore, it is prudent that we learn how to travel on God's "highways."

But before we even start the journey, we need to agree on a map. Do we use our own navigating systems created from a long line of tried-but-true experiences, or do we use another source which is outside of ourselves? Psalm 119 wrestles with similar traveling issues:

*I have considered on my ways, and have turned my steps to your statutes.* Psalm 119:59

This psalmist thought on his ways and decided God's ways were higher, truer and more reliable than his own ways. He logically decided to travel using God's eternal chart instead of his own. In fact, he esteemed God's word above all earthly benefits.

*Because I love your commands more than gold, more than pure gold, and because I consider all your precepts right, I hate every wrong path.* Psalm 119:127-128

Notice that the psalmist considered all of God's precepts, not just the ones he agreed with.

But beware: this psalmist also experienced dead ends from using his own "on-star" system before yielding to God's supernatural radar.

*Before I was afflicted I went astray; but now have I kept thy word.* Psalm 119:67

In the end, this psalmist kept God's Word and reaped its benefits. His journey was no longer at night but illuminated by God's light.

*Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.* Psalm 119:105

Traveling by the light of day is easier than night traveling. During the day, the signs and even the road bumps are more visible. God's Word provided light for his travels to keep him from getting lost—he might have stumbled at times—but he focused on the guide and continued on the right path.

God gives us the general map of his Word with many life-suggestion signs, which helps to plot out our daily trips. It helps us to travel

without too many detours, dead ends or road-blocks, but like the highway patrol, God expects us to know and to yield to his commands.

*Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man.* Ecclesiastes 12:13

So, grab your keys, buckle your seat belt and reach in the glove compartment for the map, as we learn in the next few weeks about some of God's roadside signs, which will help us on our summer travels as we yield to them. See you on the road!

## **The Celebration of Holy Communion**

A Note to Our Guests and Visitors . . . The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine.
