Members and non-members are invited to attend, but only members 18 years old and up will be able to vote. Childcare is provided.



Gloria Dei will continue to cultivate a relationship with the Lutheran Church Missions in Uganda (LCMU) by sponsoring a trip for Alex Musegula, National Director of Worship and Ronald Muyamba, National Director of Media. The



Their itinerary begins in Austin, Texas on July 23 where they will meet Steve Kohtz, Director of Worship, for a four-day National Worship Leader Conference, which is led by current renowned worship leaders and song writers as well as cuttingedge industrial technology companies.

"I am excited for them to experience and

envelop the high end of worship that this conference will exhibit," said Steve. "It will be exciting to see what things they will take back to Uganda as they continue to develop an indigenous worship for their tribal communities."

After the conference, Alex and Ronald will travel to Iowa by car with Steve and his wife, Lynette, and son, Noah.

"I want to bring them back to Gloria Dei where they can experience the practical applications of the components of worship and technology," said Steve. "During their visit, we hope to show them the hospitality, friendliness and spirit of Iowa and our congregation."

The men will spend most of August with several families from Gloria Dei's worship team. During the day, they will shadow Steve and Chris Onsrud, Director of Media Ministry, in preparing worship services, selecting music and working with multi-media technologies.

They also will be an integral part of the Solutions '07 Conference, which Gloria Dei is sponsoring August 16-17. The conference is held to teach and equip smaller churches in Iowa with the needed skills for vibrant worship.

Finally, Ronald and Alex will participate in worship and speak to the congregation on several occasions. A reception in their honor will be held after the worship services on July 29 where members of the congregation can get to know these men. Because English is the common language of Uganda, both men will be able to converse freely with the congregation.




