Light in a Foreign Land

Tongues of fire, men speaking in an unknown tongue and God's saving message concerning Jesus Christ were the beginnings of the Christian Church. Normally, we celebrate that event as Pentecost, 50 days after Easter; however, this year we will begin celebrating its powerful implications for three consecutive weeks starting today as we enter Phase III of *Ablaze*. Pastor Burcham will

preach on how we, individually and collectively, are called to reveal our faith to the world. In the previous *Ablaze* campaigns, we have rekindled the fire of faith in our hearts and discovered how to keep it burn-

ing brightly; now it is time to reveal that faith to the world.

Scripture makes it clear that we are to shine and live as children of the light.

For you were once in darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light. Ephesians 5:8

The light God gives is not supposed to be selfcontained. In fact, God wants it radiating throughout our realms of influence.

Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. Matthew 5:15

A dictionary definition of light is: the energy producing a sensation of brightness that makes seeing possible.

A few months ago, I was on a mission trip in Mexico. On our off times, my husband and I

would venture from the group and explore the non-tourist areas of the neighborhoods. Neither my husband nor I speak Spanish, so our connections to the locals were limited. This particular afternoon, I was thirsty and ventured into a one-room grocery store. As I tried to communicate my desire for a "Coca Cola," Abruela, we later found out, was patient and gracious as he looked in the shop's refrigerator for a coke that wasn't there.

He nicely suggested a red drink, which I purchased. (And if you are wondering, it was a watered-down version of Hawaiian punch, perfectly safe and drinkable.) A few days later, we were once again exploring the neighborhood looking for a particular

store, which we could not find. We found ourselves again in Abruela's store, this time asking for directions. Again, Abruela was gracious and patient and tried to give directions to these crazy tourists. He communicated on our level by first drawing a picture and then using hand motions. He then pointed and slowly counted the city blocks to our desired destination.

"Uno," he said pointing right.

"Si," we said.

"Uno, dos, tres," he said pointing left.

We got it, one block right and then three blocks left. We "gracias'd" him and proceeded on our way.

In a foreign land, Abruela was our light, our compass. He spoke on our level with a warm smile. Isn't that what we are supposed to do for people around us? Our lives can actually warm and maybe even melt people's hearts as we reflect God's light and give directions to those in our neighborhood.

Strategic Planning Updates

Thank you to those of you who took the time to provide feedback and ask questions on the topic of strategic planning for Gloria Dei. We listened carefully and took all of your comments, questions and concerns seriously. We hope that you will continue to be involved and in touch.

A motion was passed by the Governing Board during their May 16 meeting to instruct the Strategic Ministry Action Team (SMAT) to conduct further detailed research into the concept of relocating the congregation to a larger site that can accommodate growth.

As stated in the recommendation, the next steps are:

- Develop a communication plan that will inform the Governing Board and congregation on a regular basis of the research, findings, and conclusions. This communication will use mail, Weekly Word, the Web, audio visual methods and verbal components, most likely including small group presentations to every member of the congregation.
- 2. Add a member to the Strategic Planning Ministry Action Team with experience in communications. Tina Hoffman will be joining the team in this capacity.
- 3. Identify intermediate strategic steps required to meet the goal.
- 4. Develop a tactical plan that provides details on what must be accomplished each year between now and 2011, including milestones that will trigger each action
- Include in all research impacts to facilities, ministries and staff.
- 6. Begin the process of identifying suitable property that could be used for a new location or to sell for profit if the further research doesn't support the need for the land.
- 7. Begin planning for all of the transitional issues such as:
 - Continuing growth in membership at our current site
 - · Giving projections
 - · Potential for capital fund-raising campaigns

- Intermediate facilities adaptations needed at the 8301 location
- 8. Submit a proposal for land purchase to the congregation for a vote in late 2006 or early 2007.
- 9. Submit a detailed Strategic Plan to the congregation for a vote when appropriate.
- 10. Submit plans for intermediate facility changes at 8301 Aurora to the congregation for a vote before any changes are made.
- 11. Submit plans for any long term facilities needs to the congregation for approval before any action is taken.

In addition to the next steps stated in the recommendation report, the Governing Board instructed the SMAT to include the additional steps of:

- 12. Research the concept of planting a church.
- 13. Provide opportunities for continuing involvement of the congregation in the discussion.
- 14. Report back to the Governing Board by their July meeting with a comprehensive communication plan around the initiative.


