Crime Scene Investigation: Coveting

The scene of this week's crime is at David's palace in II Samuel. As the king of Israel, David was supposed to be at battle but stayed home

and found himself on the roof looking at a beautiful woman named Bathsheba. As the story unfolds, we know that David's sin escalates when he sends for Bathsheba, gets her pregnant and then develops a plot for the demise of Uriah, Bathsheba's husband.

This story seems almost too bad to believe. How could a wonderful man like David spiral into moral decay? Perhaps, coveting is one of the pieces of evidence found at David's crime scene.

In Exodus, God tells us not to

covet our neighbor's house, wife, ox, donkey, or anything that belongs to our neighbor. I am not sure about you, but I don't covet my neighbor's ox or donkey; however, I do, at times, covet my neighbor's John Deere tractor.

In fact, our society fuels itself by coveting things. Advertisements blast the "I gotta have" mentality and then seal it with "you gotta keep up with the Jones" bait.

God deals with the entire problem in James 4:

What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures. James 4:1-3

> Although those words seem harsh, they do bring relief when we adhere to them. James continues the instruction:

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Grieve, mourn and wail. Change your laughter to mourning and your joy to gloom. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will

lift you up. James 4:7-10

God's remedy to coveting is to submit to him—he is to be the first, not the second or third on the list when we need something. We go awry when we start to covet what our neighbor has and bypass God's ability to supply our needs. He wants to be the supplier of our needs, but we must first go to him and ask:

"Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" Luke 11:11-13

The crime of coveting can be avoided if we go to the supplier of life and simply ask for what we need.



The Celebration of Holy Communion

A Note to Our Guests and Visitors ... The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine.
