The Strategic Plan Implementation Ministry Action Team (SPI MAT), which consists of two members from each of the four focus groups, Ministry, Future Facilities, Finance and Communication; a project manager and a recording secretary continue to meet to plan for the necessary steps to implement the Strategic Plan.

Since volumes of research, studies and tasks will be accumulated, she will develop a Gantt chart, a task list with timelines and dependencies that will be used as a communication mechanism to help each focus group accomplish its individual goals set forth in the Strategic Plan.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment

Last March, the Governing Board piloted a new voting process by setting up expanded voting times and informational meetings for the Strategic Plan vote. More than 40 percent of our congregation participated in this process, which is a significant increase from the normal Sunday afternoon voter's meeting.

The Governing Board received positive feedback concerning this voting process; therefore, they propose the following title change and amendment addition to the bylaws to be inserted in article II after number 4. These two modifications will be voted on at the annual congregational meeting Sunday, June 22 at 1 p.m. in the sanctuary.

Proposed Bylaw Amendments:

1. Title Change:

Changing title of Article II from, Meetings of the Congregation, to, Congregational Proceedings.

2. Text Insertion:

5. Voting process: Unless otherwise stated in a procedure to be followed or referenced in other Articles, members may vote by casting ballots at a designated voting location over a designated time period approved by the Governing Board. The use of absentee ballots is acceptable. Those members casting ballots shall constitute a quorum. A vote may only be taken, after the congregation has had opportunities to review information and attend informational meetings on the matter to be voted upon. Proper notification of the informational meetings, voting date(s), which shall include the hours, and voting location, shall consist of written announcement at weekend worship services for at least two (2) consecutive weeks, prior to such events.

This new voting process could be used for the following items in Article I requiring a vote. The first one is the reason for requesting this bylaw amendment; the last two would be affected as they do not have specific procedures in place:

Article I

- 3. Acquisition or Disposition of Real Property
- 4. Incurrence of Indebtedness
- 7. Excommunication of a member of the Congregation

It does not change the existing voting process for the following items in article I that require a vote:

- 1. Calling a Pastor
- 2. Removal of Pastor
- 5. Election or Removal of Members of the Governing Board
- 6. Ratification of the Annual Budget
- 7. The Amendment of the Constitution and By Laws

Current bylaws can be located on the Web site on the Governing Board page. The Governing Board is committed to making the voting process as accessible as possible to the congregation because they believe that each vote will provide long-term direction to Gloria Dei.

Informational meetings to review this amendment as well as the budget will be held on June 8 at 10 a.m., June 14 at 6:30 p.m., and June 18 at 6 p.m.

Work in Honduras

The Reason for the Trip: For several years, members from Gloria Dei and other churches have joined forces with the World Gospel Outreach (WGO) to help the poor in Honduras. In June, 21 members from Gloria Dei and six members from Lord of Life Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota will once again partner with this organization. The team, led by Pastor Phillips, will provide medical, dental and optometry services to an anticipated 1,500 residents of the Tegucigalpa area. Their services will include prescribing and giving medicine; diagnosing ailments; providing eye exams and prescription glasses; cleaning and extracting teeth (if needed); washing children's hair; and sharing the love of Jesus. In addition to providing medical services, a small group from the team will help with the WGO's construction of a dormitory for homeless children. The team will also hand out quilts made by members of the Gloria Dei Quilters.

A Glimpse into One Team Member's Story: What started as a casual observation over 11

years ago has become a lifelong passion for one member of Gloria Dei. In 1997, Cheryl Gilg and her husband, Joe, attended a medical mission workshop. Cheryl, a registered nurse, commented that she would participate if Gloria Dei ever hosted such a trip. Her casual remark was challenged eight years later when Pastor Phillips announced the plans to travel to Honduras to provide medical services to the impoverished people of Honduras.

"At this point, I remembered my words and knew I had to go," says Cheryl.

Since the first trip, Cheryl has become a regular member of each yearly *Cheryl Gilg* mission team. She declares that the experience has completely changed her perspective because she saw the Hondurans' great appreciation in the midst of their abject poverty.

"It's amazing; the people are incredibly patient as they wait in lines for hours to receive medical services, and yet they are so appreciative," said Cheryl. "Similarly, when they hear the Gospel, they are like sponges soaking up every word."

Cheryl has also gleaned from the culture's emphasis on family and friends. She explains that when people wait in line, they are not looking at their watches like Americans do; instead, they are chatting and laughing with each other about their families and their lives. Oftentimes, the mothers will not only bring their own children to these medical brigades, but will also bring their neighbor's children.

"Their family and neighbors are so important to these people," said Cheryl.

Cheryl encourages everyone to participate in at least one mission trip. She believes great growth occurs in viewing a foreign culture and seeing God work in the midst of an unfamiliar and sometimes, uncomfortable, setting.

"I have been stretched in many ways on these trips," said Cheryl. "But I have never been outstretched to a place where God did not meet me. God has never left me and has been there to help."

Tiny Treasures Lutheran Preschool finished its third year of school this week; 93 preschoolers in the regular program and 15 playgroup children celebrated with their families and classmates at picnics.

As teachers work this week to organize and inventory classrooms, they will also prepare for fall classes. New this fall to Tiny Treasures will be the addition of a Friday class for three-year-olds and a separate prekindergarten afternoon class on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

Another exciting addition to Tiny Treasures starting in the fall is our pilot after-preschool childcare session Monday-Fridays from 3-5:30 p.m. As we continue to grow this ministry, childcare seems to be the need for many families. This addition might make it easier for more children to come to our afternoon preschool program. The cost for the 5 childcare sessions will be \$45 a week; no registration costs are required.
