Soaking Up Power

More than 6 million cubic feet of water spill over the rocky crestline of Niagara Falls every minute. Each day thousands of visitors marvel at its beauty and power as they stand watching the water gush downward, which eventually disperses to thousands of miles of tributaries, adding nutrients to any dry ground it touches.

In power and force beyond the strength of Niagara Falls, God poured out his Holy Spirit to a group of people in Acts 2. According to the account, the God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven were gathered in one place, and suddenly a sound filled the house and they became "filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them." The occurrence caused quite a shock wave of conversations among the spectators. Questions ricocheted in the crowd: "Why are these Galileans speaking our language when we know for a fact that a few minutes ago, they could not speak our language? How can this happen? What does this mean?"

Even though the crowd was amazed at these spiritual happenings, they should not have been shocked to see God's power. Historically and culturally speaking, this Jewish crowd would have been taught about the glorious power of God through the account of creation. "Let there be light and there was light." Likewise, stories about their miraculous Red Sea escape, the daily provisions of manna in the wilderness, the angel of death passing over their infants, and the walls of Jericho crumbling down were passed down from generation to generation. Besides, weeks before this event, they heard that a man named Jesus rose from the dead and was visibly seen talking to people. Before that time, the daily grapevine was filled with stories about the lame walking, the deaf hearing and the blind seeing. Not to mention, the recent words which were spoken by Jesus before his ascension that prophesied of the upcoming power.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

Throughout history, God has lavishly poured out his power unto people. Most of the time, the people were in desperate need and powerless. In fact, the less qualified, the weaker, the better.

But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things-and the things that are not-to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before him. I Corinthians 1:27-29

On the day of Pentecost, God intentionally poured out his Spirit on all people. Although it surprised them, it shouldn't have. He wanted mankind to understand that his power, a power stronger than Niagara Falls, trumped their weaknesses and that his care added more nutrients to their rocky hearts than all the water pouring over Niagara Falls.



Life Transformed to Help Others.

What started out as a simple question about Kentucky mission work branched into a life that is now dedicated to mission work locally, nationally and internationally.

Bill Clark, member of Gloria Dei, originally wanted to join the Kentucky mission team in 2005, but could not because

of a schedule conflict. Instead he opted to travel with a team from Gloria Dei to provide medical supplies to the people in Honduras. His life has never been the same since.

"I have never been out of the country, so I was very nervous. But the entire experience was very motivating and eyeopening," said Bill.

His first trip made such an impression that he decided to return the following year and plans to join Gloria Dei's Honduras team on June 23-30. In addition,

Bill has begun training to become a team leader for Habitat for Humanity's work in third-world countries; his first assignment begins next Sunday in El Salvador.

Bill states that his experiences have made him more aware of the needs of others. "Even though I can't speak the language, it is amazing to see how people respond to the smallest things that we might give to them," said Bill. "I received more than I ever gave."

Basketball

Bill recalls how he was able to share the love of Jesus to a woman who came in for a doctor's appointment. The next day the woman excitedly tugged at Bill's arm, because she had brought her children to meet him and to see the doctor.

Bill's perspective of living in America has also changed. "I

am very lucky to have what I have," said Bill. "I sometimes ask myself: Why was I lucky to be born in the United States as compared to Honduras where I probably would have lived and slept on dirt floors?"

Without the support of his wife, Lesli; and his three children, Manda, 13, Sydney, 6, and Kelsey, 4; and the people from Gloria Dei, Bill would not be pursing this newlyfound passion. After the two summer trips, Bill plans to build and support teams internationally, nationally and locally.

^{5.} "Five years ago I would have never thought about going on a trip like this, now I can't imagine not going," said Bill. "I think going on a mission trip is part of God's command to fulfill the great commission as spoken in Matthew 28:16-20. It has certainly changed my life in almost everything I do on a day-to-day basis. My goal is to now bring the same experience I have had to as many people as possible."


