Jews for Jesus to Perform

Gloria Dei will host The Liberated Wailing Wall on Friday, May 23 at 7 p.m. in the Family Life Center.

The Liberated Wailing Wall, a mobile evangelistic music team from the Jews for Jesus organization, has been bringing Jewish gospel music, testimony and drama to churches, college campuses and city streets for more than 30 years. Besides their national and international tours, they have recorded 12 albums, including their latest, "Never Forget." Their unique Jewish gospel music sounds like a blend of Israeli folk and "Fiddler on the Roof." It is joyous, upbeat and lively.



When the Liberated Wailing Wall sings, expect to find yourself tapping your toes, clapping your hands and singing along.

History

In the early 1970s, a group of Jews for Jesus began singing on street corners in and around San Francisco. They didn't win worldwide acclaim, but some people did stop and listen, people who were



surprised to hear Jewish melodies with lyrics about Jesus. At the same time, the group brought a little bit of Jewishness to the churches as they shared their unique music. This group of singing street missionaries was the origi-

nal Liberated Wailing Wall. Through the years, some 120 energetic individuals have traveled around the world as part of the various Liberated Wailing Wall teams. For more information about this group, go to www.jewsforjesus.org.

Work in Honduras

For several years members from Gloria Dei and other churches have joined forces with the World Gospel Outreach (WGO) to help the poor in Honduras. In June, 21 members from Gloria Dei and six members from Lord of Life Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota will once again partner with this organization.

The Team

The team, led by Pastor Phillips, will provide medical, dental and optometry services to an anticipated 1,500 residents of the Tegucigalpa area. Their services will include prescribing and giving medicine; diagnosing ailments; providing eye exams and prescription glasses; cleaning and extracting teeth (if needed); washing children's hair; and sharing the love of Jesus. In addition to providing medical services, a

a small group from the team will help with the WGO's construction of a dormitory for homeless children. The team will also hand out quilts made by members of the Gloria Dei Quilters.

The Mission and History of the World Gospel Outreach

Founded in 1984 by Alan Danforth, the WGO has supplied medical care and shared the gospel with thousands of residents in Honduras. This year more than 900 people will serve God by helping the Hondurans on week-long mission trips. During their week, WGO serves as the facilitator to help team members minister to the poor. In addition to providing medical needs to those in need, the WGO has a 90-acre ranch that houses abused and homeless children. Recently, a school has been built on the ranch where children can receive a bilingual education.

Items Needed

A few of the members from this year's team will be in the narthex today to share about their upcoming trip. They are also collecting the following items for the trip: children's and adult vitamins and Tylenol, baby shampoo, hair pretties, hair gel and detangler, Zip-loc bags (sandwich and gallon size) and eye glasses (any size, prescription will work.)

Weekends at Gloria Dei

Nursery

Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level, access is through the doors in the narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Cry room

Located in the southeast corner of the narthex is a room for parents to take their small children when they are upset or crying. This room allows full view of the sanctuary and has full audio to hear the service.

Families worship together

With the exception of the 7:45 a.m. service, the first 20 minutes of each worship service is designed for families to worship together. At that point in the service, children and youth will be invited to join their peers in an educational time specifically for them as outlined below.

Grace Place - preschool and elementary children

During the school year: We offer Grace Place, our weekend educational time, for children ages 3 to fifth grade at three different times: Saturday from 5:50-6:30 p.m.; Sunday from 9:20-10 a.m.; and Sunday from 10:50-11:30 a.m. Children will be invited from worship to attend Grace Place. They will gather outside of worship and leaders will escort them to their classrooms. Summer Grace Place begins May 18 at 9:20 a.m.

Castaway - youth

For our junior high youth in grades 6-8, we have a high-energy educational time, Castaway, in the Youth Center starting Sunday, May 18 at 9 a.m.

Senior high and adults

Our senior high youth in grades 9-12 are invited to a study next Sunday from 9-10 a.m. in rooms 134-38 Adults are invited to join us for an in-depth journey using materials from the Lifelight series in rooms 131-33 from 9:20-10:20 a.m.
