Joy-filled Hearts Reap Bountiful Blessings

A few weeks ago, a dear friend of mine was diagnosed with leukemia. Although the survival rate is high, the road to recovery holds weeks of hospital stays and treatments. Her sister, who is 20 years older, came to my friend's side and quietly said, "Honey, I took care of you when you were born, and now I am just as happy to take care of you while you are sick." Cora traveled hundreds of miles to relieve the immediate family—she stayed all night at the hospital, cooked meals, cleaned the house and provided a motherly influence for two teenagers grasping with the reality of their mother's illness.

Cora viewed the entire stay in Des Moines with a joy-filled heart—she only wanted to give to her sister. She could have traveled to Des Moines out of a perceived obligation and performed the same daily tasks, instead she joyfully gave. Cora's actions not only benefited my friend and her family, but also ricocheted back to her.

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 NIV

God loves a cheerful giver. He loves when people are generous in every aspect of life. In the gospel, there was a woman who was noted for her giving. Although her giving was less in quantity than those who went before her, Jesus commended this woman's generous heart.

"I tell you the truth," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on." Luke 21:4 NIV

God concentrates on the heart and not the outward appearance. He desires that we give from a joy-filled heart. The Bible is saturated with stellar examples of God's generosity. Giving is inseparable with God. Didn't he give manna to the hungry, deliverance to the afflicted Israelites, water to the thirsty, safety to the forlorn traveler, protection from the enemy and strength to the weak? When we look at all that God has done for us, it seems logical to joyfully give back to him. Farmers take this truth a step further when they plant and harvest their crops. 
