
Reclaiming Your Identity

In today's world many Christians have lost their identity and principles by adopting the ways of the world. The distinctions between Christian and worldly con-

This is a long-standing problem, but it is now rapidly changing the way Christians think. The world today has adopted a pluralized view of God that many paths lead to the same place. The Church has been stripped of its authority.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade—kept in heaven for you. I Peter 1:3-4

Ministry Partner Highlight Woodworking Hobby Leads to Many Opportunities

Since we encourage our members to give outside of our campus, when we hear about individuals who do so, we try to highlight their endeavors. Our thinking is that it will inspire others to freely share the gifts and talents that God has given them.

Mo Grotheer, member of Gloria Dei, volunteers at Freedom for Youth Ministry by conducting wood classes for men who have recently been released from prison. Mo enjoys working with the men because of their eagerness to learn the wood craft and how it opens avenues to foster relationships.

"At first they appear very apprehensive, but after a few classes, they seem to open up," said Mo. "These men have had so much negative in their lives that any positive activity on their part needs to be encouraged and applauded," said Mo.

In addition to his work with the wood class, Mo has made three wooden gospel bowls in the last nine months. One such bowl, he gave to the director of Freedom for Youth Ministry, who used it to share the Gospel. Mo explains about the bowl:

"In this bowl the struggle between good and evil is represented by light (maple) and dark (black walnut) wood. Beginning at the base of the bowl, the strips of white, black, red and brown wood represent all the people, races of the world. They are all living under sin, darkness and eternal death represented by the dark wood at the lower portion of the bowl. When the Holy Spirit calls individuals by the Gospel, they come to faith in Jesus Christ as their Savior, from sin and eternal death. The four crosses represent the Gospel; everything Jesus did, he lived, suffered, died and rose from the dead for forgiveness of our sins. With faith in Jesus Christ we live enlightened lives and enjoy the grace of our Lord and Savior. The light upper portion of the bowl represents our lives with Christ. The extra dark black walnut crosses represent the deepest darkness of the world's sins borne by Jesus on the cross. "

The bowl is signed by Mo and reflects the poem, "Trees," written by Joyce Kilmer: "wood is turned by guys like me, but only God can make a tree." The bowl can be viewed at the church office during the weekdays.

Flu Updates

In every area of ministry at Gloria Dei, we are committed to take the necessary steps to prevent the spread of any communicable disease. To date, we have

placed postcards throughout the building reminding us to fight the flu by the three C's: Cover your cough. Clean your hands. Contain the germs.

Another important issue to address within our church is handshaking, which we are encouraging people not to do until the threat of spreading the flu is over. We have also provided hand sanitizers throughout the build-



ing. In addition, we continue to disinfect tables, toys, doorknobs, and routinely disinfect public areas such as the classrooms, bathrooms, kitchen, Family Life Center and Sanctuary.

A Ministry Action Team is being formed to study the issues associated with communicable diseases within our church environment. "We are doing everything possible to ensure the safety of all of our members at Gloria Dei by taking the necessary steps as prescribed by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)," said Bill Jesse, Executive Director.

OSHA Flu Guidelines

The United States Department of Labor has issued some simple guidelines:

- Stay home if you are sick.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or with a hand sanitizer.
- · Avoid touching your nose, mouth and eyes.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough and sneeze into your upper sleeve. Dispose of tissues in no-touch trash receptacles.
- Wash your hands or use a hand sanitizer after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.
- Avoid shaking hands and always wash your hands after physical contact with others.
- Keep frequently-touched common surfaces clean (for example, phones, computer equipment, etc.).

Urbandale Pantry Update

In 2008, Pastor Burcham was involved with the startup of the Ministerial Alliance of Urbandale and the City of Urbandale to create a DMARC food pantry for the local residents in need. Gloria Dei's Beacon of Blessings soon became involved with overseeing monthly collections earmarked for the pantry and Naomi Circle collected monetary donations twice a year.



The following is an update from the Urbandale Food Pantry Coordinator, Eileen Boggess:

"As the months have progressed, so has the need for services. When we first opened our doors, we supplied approximately 125 families (350 individuals) from Urbandale and Windsor Heights with a five-day emergency supply of food each month. During the month of July, we provided approximately 160 families (469 individuals) with an emergency supply of food. We have also provided each of these families with a personal product bag that contains shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet tissues, feminine hygiene products, diapers and laundry soap."

We are thankful for the service that the pantry provides to those in need. We will continue to support them by our monthly donations of requested items and by our monetary donations. 
