The Importance of Reformation

Martin Luther wanted an open debate when he nailed the 95 Theses to Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany in 1517. "How can I know for certain that I will survive judgment on the last day?" was the question he posed. Indulgences and pieces of paper that stated forgiveness of sins were the rage of the town—hand over a few coins and forgiveness was assured. Luther was concerned because people believed "when they bought indulgence letters they are then assured of their salvation... (whereas) on no occasion has Christ ordered that indulgences should be preached, but he forcefully commanded the gospel to be preached. What a horror...to permit the loud noise of indulgences... while the gospel is silenced."

Luther clearly believed that forgiveness of sins flows directly from Christ to every sinner. "Any truly repentant Christian has a right to full remission of penalty and guilt even without indulgence letters," Luther commented.

Why remember a day that occurred almost 500 years ago? Besides its history implications, it is imperative, practical and life-changing to understand the depth of the grace of God. Martin Luther and those who worked with him answered the eternal questions by turning to the scriptures and discovering that completeness lies solely in Jesus Christ.

This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. Romans 3:22-24 Being right with God is his doing, grace alone saves us. God reaches down with his amazing grace and makes our relationship with him right and good.

I have a good friend, Dave, who owned a grave-digging business with his brother. One day they had to close the grave of a seven-year-old boy who had drowned in the creek. His mother was standing nearby and started to weep uncontrollably when the dirt encompassed her boy's grave. Dave's brother walked over to her and gently put his arm on her shoulder and said, "I know it hurts, being apart is going to be hard. Was your son baptized?" She nod-ded yes. "Then always remember that Jesus really did die too. And because he's alive today, your son will live again in heaven with Jesus."

Does the Reformation matter on a personal level? To this woman's heart, reformation mattered. Her young boy is not in heaven because he died young or accidentally, but because Jesus willingly died for him. When Jesus died it wasn't the end of the story, it is the beginning of life for this young boy and for us. We have been redeemed completely by the blood of the lamb. We can be certain of eternal life solely because of what Christ wrought on the cross.

God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. Romans 3:25-26




