## Be a Babushka to People Around You

God was outlawed, but not outlived when the Communist party destroyed the churches, imprisoned and killed the priests; and disbanded religious instruction at home and school. A phenomenon soon emerged after the Communist party fell from power—thousands of young Russian worshippers expressed a deep and mature faith. How could this happen when religion was outlawed throughout every tentacle of society? According to Philip Yancey in *What's so Amazing about Grace*, the Communist party ignored a group of old grandmothers, commonly called babushkas.

When the state cracked down on the church, it ignored this group: let the old women sweep the floors and sell the candles and cling to the traditions until they all die off, they reasoned. The aged hands of the babushkas, though, rocked the cradles. Young churchgoers today often say they first learned about God in childhood through the hymns and stories Grandma would whisper as they drifted off to sleep.

These harmless and weak individuals of society made an impact on an uncertain future by equipping their sphere of influence with the knowledge of God. By the naked eye, their teaching sphere was less than optimal; their subjects were little ones who could not even formulate words; their classrooms were dark and dingy; and their resources, like books and churches, did not exist and yet they equipped those around them with the knowledge about a loving God. These wonderful babushkas understood an important Biblical principle—equipping should be an integral part of a believer's life despite the circumstances.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. Colossians 3:16

Equipping often requires us to live outside our comfort zone. In Scripture we find many people who, when touched by the Holy Spirit, left their

> comfort zone to follow his lead. Peter was a successful fisherman, Matthew was a tax collector, and Luke was probably a physician to the wealthy. Thousands of others in the early church also shed their own comfort to

touch their neighbors with Christ's love. They had been given something that they knew changed lives, and they wanted to live it and share it effectively. For example, a crippled man's life was completely transformed when Peter and John spoke the following words: "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I have I given you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Peter and John gave what they had been freely given by Jesus Christ and revolutionized this man's life.

We have the awesome privilege of equipping others with the good news of Jesus Christ, of being babushkas to those who are around us on a daily basis. Like a grandmother who cradles her grandchildren, we have been tenderly touched by Christ's loving hands and can now freely give his love to our neighbors.
