Who are you going to believe?

Before I traveled to Omaha last weekend, I checked a few weather channels to see if I should even proceed. Weather.com stated that no precipitation was expected until evening; undergroundweather.com declared that freezing sleet and snow was expected throughout the day while KCCI.com acknowledged the likelihood of rain. Three professional organizations had three completely different forecasts. Who should I believe?

Has that ever happened to you? You seek advice from several reputable companies only to find out that each has a different opinion. You then have to weigh the facts

and make a decision accordingly. Or sometimes you ask only one source who gives you advice that is contrary to what you wanted to hear.

How about if you didn't even ask for direction and received it anyway? Abraham, in Genesis 12, found himself in the midst of a similar situation.

As the story unfolds, we find a 75-year-old Abraham living in Haran with his extended family until the Lord said, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you."

Imagine those words coming from God. Have you ever thought how Abraham heard those words? Did he literally hear those words? And if so, how does the voice of God actually sound? Did it take time for Abraham to process what was told to him? Was there a great wrestling match between Abraham and the Lord? Was he allowed to ask questions, such as why now, Lord? Or why me, Lord? Or did he immediately embrace those instructions and follow without debate?

Scripture does not fill us in with the details of his reaction to God's directives, but it does inform us on how Abraham responded to the information, "So Abram left, as the Lord had told him." Genesis 12:4

Hebrews gives us even more insight into this man's life: "By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going." Hebrews 11:8

In a world full of thousands of voices and opinions, Abraham's example of selective hearing gives us direction because he selected God's words above all else. And even though the road wasn't clear or defined—Abraham was further tested by God's orders to sacrifice Isaac as we will learn more about today. If you were Abraham, what would you have done? Or even more poignant, what would you do if God asked you to do something that was contrary to all the plans that you have already made for your life? At that junction, who are you going to believe?

Multi-site ministry task force – A relatively new way congregations are expanding their ministries is through multi-site ministry. This is where one church meets in multiple locations. One option might be to move the youth ministry to a new location, which could be on our own property or a building that is geographically close to our existing campus. This option could also open up the original Sanctuary for medium-sized gatherings as well as a worship venue.

It is our desire to listen to the findings of the task force teams, ask questions to ensure that every facet has been researched and then discuss the information. Meanwhile, please keep the task force teams in your prayers as they research the possible avenues to fulfill our Strategic Plan that God has placed before us.

Remember Haiti

This month marked the one-year anniversary of the devastating quake that killed an estimated 300,000 people and left millions homeless. It has been reported that

many Haitians have lost hope that their country will recover from destruction, disease and political turmoil.

But we can help! Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) has organized an effort to slow the tide of cholera that has killed 1,034 people and hospitalized more than 16,000 by providing the needed medicines and water filters.

"The needs are extremely urgent and growing more critical by the minute," said Rev. Glenn F. Merritt, director of Disaster Response with LCMS World Relief and Human Care (WR-HC). He stressed that cholera, which is spread through

contaminated water and food, is a preventable and treatable disease. People can die after 6 to 7 hours if there is no serum and antibiotics.

Even though the Synod's mercy arm has knowledgeable staff and capable partners on the ground in Haiti, they need continued support from caring donors in order to meet growing physical and spiritual needs in Haiti.

Infusion-Contemporary Worship: Sunday at 10:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary: This service offers high-energy worship using contemporary Christian songs and praise music.

Other Important Items

Nursery: Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level with access through the doors in the narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Cry room: Located in the southwest corner of the narthex is a room with a full view of the Sanctuary for parents to take their small children when they are upset or crying.

Communion

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays and Sundays during the services in the Family Life Center.

A note to our guests and visitors: The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.

Weekly Bible Reading

Genesis 12:1-4, 22:2-8 (NIV)

The LORD had said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. "I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." So Abram left, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Haran.

Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about." Early the next morning Abraham got up and saddled his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance.
