Mixed emotions surface at the brink of any journey. There is the last minute rush to ensure that everything is in place. Is everything packed? Did we bring our pass-

ports? Is the dog taken care of? How about the mail?



A thousand details swarm our heads as we step out the door into the new adventure. Similar thoughts flooded through my mind when I was preparing for a week long mountain climbing adventure sponsored by a faith-based organization in New Mexico during my college years. The list of supplies was long. The correct boots, rain wear and food supplies were paramount to the success of the

trip and to the team that I would be joining. For several weeks, we spent time training and learning about the terrain and even the perils of the stark New Mexico landscape that we were determined to conquer and enjoy. Even with all the preparation, I was completely intimidated because I knew the pending wildlife experience was completely outside my normal get-away adventures. After all, we would be without electricity, modern conveniences and stores for seven days, as well as the reality of my fear of heights, insects and snakes.

As I approached the bus with all my gear, the other teammates cheerfully conversed about the possibilities of our expedition. The guide quietly listened to our bantering before commenting, "It's good to get out of your normal routine because God can finally get your undivided attention."

My heart raced with these words, not for their wisdom, but for the reality that God would be traveling with me during the seven days. In other words, in my hurry to leave town, I didn't forget to pack him and he certainly never left me!

Those words would prove to be a great comfort for this wilderness novice especially during one of the most difficult climbs affectionately known as "The Chimney." It's name aptly described the climb—two parallel rock formations that stood upright for approximately 80 feet with a three-foot span between the rock surfaces.

"And you want me to climb this rock?" I asked.

"The view will be worth the climb," replied our guide.

To this day, I am not sure how I maneuvered up that rock so quickly. I do remember contorting my body in every possible way to shimmy up the chimney. Using the last of my arm strength, I finally pulled myself over the edge of the chimney to the top of the mountain. The beauty that now surrounded my panoramic view was unfamiliar but completely astounding as the distant trees and rocks created a sharp contrast against the blue sky. It was worth the climb to see the view.

This week, we ask you to leave your cares at home and embark on a 16-week journey with us as we travel through the Bible in a message series entitled "Destination-Resurrection: Where am I in God's plan?" Thankfully, you will not be required to physically climb or combat any harsh situations, but you will be in a position to see a view that you have never seen before. Town Hall Meetings



Genesis 1:1-2, 26-31 (NIV)
