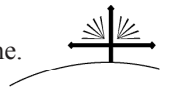

Dual Citizenship

As we celebrated the fourth of July last Monday, I became very cognizant of the benefits of being an American citizen. I have freedom of speech, freedom to worship and the freedom to vote. America even allows me to live under the great umbrella of “life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.”

In Philippians, we see that we also have been given citizenship in another realm—heaven.

But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.

Philippians 3:20-21

So it appears that I have dual-citizenship. I enjoy the privileges of being an American because I not only have read about its privileges, but I have seen its realities in every aspect of my life. But what about my heavenly citizenship; do I see its realities?

In the book of Philippians, Paul not only believed in heaven, but he lived toward its transforming power.

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. Philippians 3:12-14

So, what did Paul know about heaven that would cause him to rejoice about this unseen future? Let’s look at the Scriptures for insight into what Paul saw:

Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. I Corinthians 15:51-53

He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away. Revelation 21:4

Personally, when I read these verses, my perspective begins to change. I realize that even though my citizenship in this country is a blessing, it does not compare to what is in store for me in heaven. Knowing my ultimate future makes some of the troubles and pitfalls of life shrink. Nothing can compare to seeing the Lord face-to-face; maybe that is why Paul rejoiced at the future, and so can I.

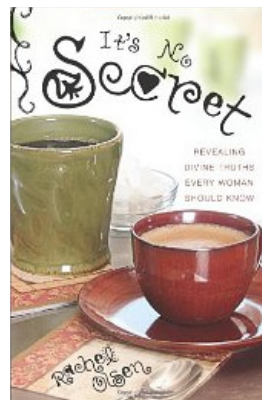

Continuing Dining Together

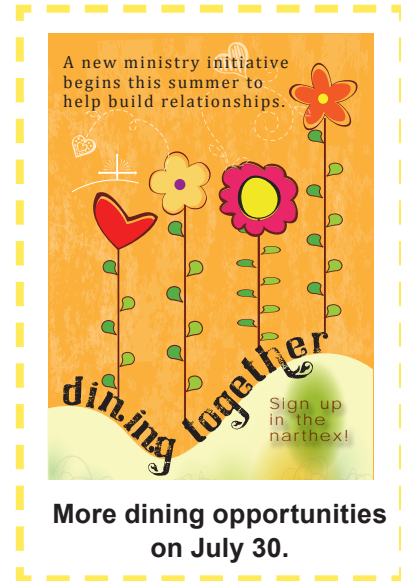

Communion

A note to our guests and visitors: The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.

Weekly Bible reading - Philippians 1:20-27a (NIV)

I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, so that through my being with you again your joy in Christ Jesus will overflow on account of me.

Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ.
