Living life with a divine purpose

This week as we continue to look at the book of Acts, we will see a growth pattern emerge from the first-century church. The Word of God was boldly preached, thousands of people believed in the name of Jesus, healings and miracles increased and fierce opposition from

the Sadducees multiplied. The cultural climate must have been tense—great deliverance and rejoicing abounded in one group while the other camp bred jealously, control and hatred.

The talk of the town must have ricocheted with questions: "Did you know my cousin believed in the name of Jesus Christ? How about my neighbor's son, he was sick one minute and then healed the next minute? Those apostles are something, aren't they? Jesus, is the way, the truth and the life, don't you want to shout it from your rooftop?

The first century church sets a great example for us, as believers. Quite frankly, they set a precedent that we should follow as they boldly proclaimed Jesus and lived their lives for him. But in order

to emulate their actions, we need to dig deeper into scripture to see what caused such devotion and boldness. Perhaps, the following verse gives us a clue:

Peter and the other apostles replied: "we must obey God rather than men! The God of our fathers raised Jesus from the dead—whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel. We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, who God has given to those who obey him." Acts 5:29-32

The reason behind all their activities and proclamations was their complete obedience toward God. In other words, they obeyed God and as a result, they received the privilege of pursuing the purpose that Jesus had given to them.

As we reflect on God's Word today, let's remember and imitate those men and women whose purpose centered around an obedience and devotion to the one worthy of their praise, Jesus.




Wednesday, July 6 - "Lord, Please Open My Eyes!" by Daniel W. McMartin

Work in Honduras

This year's trip: Members from Gloria Dei along with a team from Franklin, Tennessee and Fayetteville, Arkansas will join forces with the World Gospel Outreach (WGO) to help the poor in Honduras between June 24-July 2. Gloria Dei's team consists of Bill Clark, and his daughter, Manda; Bruce and Jennie Ganzer, and their daughter Kara; and Gary Wasko and his daughter, Kristine.

What they plan to do: The team will provide medical, dental and optometry services to an anticipated 1,500 residents of the Tegucigalpa area. Their services will include prescribing and giving medicine; diagnosing ailments; providing eye exams and prescription glasses; cleaning and extracting teeth (if needed); washing children's hair; and sharing the love of Jesus.

In addition to providing medical services, the team will lay cement floors for some of the local residents. According to a recent study, covering dirt floors with concrete leads to a significant reduction in parasitic infestations, diarrhea, anemia and also increases the cognitive development in children as well as an increase in satisfaction with the quality of life for families. The team will also hand out quilts made by members of the Gloria Dei Quilters.

Please keep the team in your prayers as they prepare for their trip.

Weekly Bible reading - Luke 24:36-49 (NIV)

While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence.

He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Communion

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays and Sundays during the services in the Family Life Center.

A note to our guests and visitors: The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.
