

Progression toward Spiritual Maturity

The guy must have been from Missouri. He always wanted proof. Gideon lived in the period of the Judges. His life experience was particularly difficult. Every summer when the crops were reaching maturity in the fields, foreign armies would invade the land where he lived. The people were broken in spirit and were so defeated that they no longer attempted to fight or defend themselves. Instead, they simply prepared places to hide in the mountains. Gideon had witnessed this hopeless situation many times. He trusted in God - but not for this.

Even when the malach-yahweh or the Angel of the Lord came and spoke with him face to face, Gideon doubted. Those were terrible times. Israel was worshipping false gods but they blamed the true God for their troubles (see Judges 6:12-17). Here is how the exchange went between the angel and Gideon:

Angel: Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?

Gideon: But Lord, how can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family.

Angel: I will be with you and you will strike down all the Midianites together. Gideon: If now I have found favor in your eyes, give me a sign that it is really you talking to me.

Do you get the point? God's words are very simple and direct. They are powerful and confident. Gideon's words are stammering and weak. He constantly weasels out of God's directives by expressing his doubts and challenging God's words. How often in our lives when things get rough do we doubt the simple strong words of God? As Gideon progressed in his faith, he learned and relearned to trust in God and his promises.

Ash Wednesday and Lenten Services

We will offer traditional Ash Wednesday services at Gloria Dei on March 9 in the Sanctuary. Our midday service from 12:15-12:45 is a great opportunity for those who have the lunch hour free. Our evening worship service will begin with children, youth and adults worshipping together until children and youth are dismissed for their educational times. Adults will remain in the Sanctuary as the "Were You There?" message series unfolds.

"Were you There?" message series: Since Calvary nothing's been the same. Do we realize the difference? Do we know what Calvary means to us? To truly understand Christ's passion, we must go back to the cross. We must see ourselves not as onlookers, but as participants in the drama. Take some time out of your busy week, and join us this Wednesday as we begin to see what the Lord experienced days before he was led to the cross.



Northwind Contemporary Worship Service: Saturday at 5:30 p.m. in the Family Life Center: This come-as-you-are service offers high-energy worship.

Traditional Worship Service: Sunday at 7:45 a.m. in the Sanctuary: Join us in this classical Lutheran worship service that utilizes all the divine services and hymns from the new Lutheran Service Book.

Traditional Worship Service: Sunday at 9 a.m. in the Sanctuary: Our classical Lutheran worship makes use of written and free-flow liturgy with traditional hymns.

H-3 Family Worship Service: Sunday at 9 a.m. in the Family Life Center: Experience the wonder of a child in this casual and friendly-family atmosphere where families with young children worship together. Other Important Items

Nursery: Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level with access through the doors in the narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Cry room: Located in the southwest corner of the narthex is a room with a full view of the Sanctuary for parents to take their small children when they are upset or crying.

Weekly Bible Reading

Judges 7:1-8 (NIV)

Early in the morning, Jerub-Baal (that is, Gideon) and all his men camped at the spring of Harod. The camp of Midian was north of them in the valley near the hill of Moreh. The LORD said to Gideon, "You have too many men for me to deliver Midian into their hands. In order that Israel may not boast against me that her own strength has saved her, announce now to the people, 'Anyone who trembles with fear may turn back and leave Mount Gilead." So twenty-two thousand men left, while ten thousand remained.

But the LORD said to Gideon, "There are still too many men. Take them down to the water, and I will sift them for you there. If I say, 'This one shall go with you,' he shall go; but if I say, 'This one shall not go with you,' he shall not go."

So Gideon took the men down to the water. There the LORD told him, "Separate those who lap the water with their tongues like a dog from those who kneel down to drink." Three hundred men lapped with their hands to their mouths. All the rest got down on their knees to drink.

The LORD said to Gideon, "With the three hundred men that lapped I will save you and give the Midianites into your hands. Let all the other men go, each to his own place." So Gideon sent the rest of the Israelites to their tents but kept the three hundred, who took over the provisions and trumpets of the others. Now the camp of Midian lay below him in the valley.

Communion

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays and Sundays during the services in the Family Life Center.

A note to our guests and visitors: The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.
