Love Your Enemies

The young man walked through the streets of Me where two fighting men there happened to be.

“Sir, help us out! We’re enemies, you see. I don’t like him, and he doesn’t like me.”

Shaking his head, the young man said, “Love your enemies. When will you learn?”

He touched his heart and softened his voice, “Think about anger it builds and it grows. Hate becomes evil - takes all that you know. Love and friendship disappear while hate and resentment live in here.”

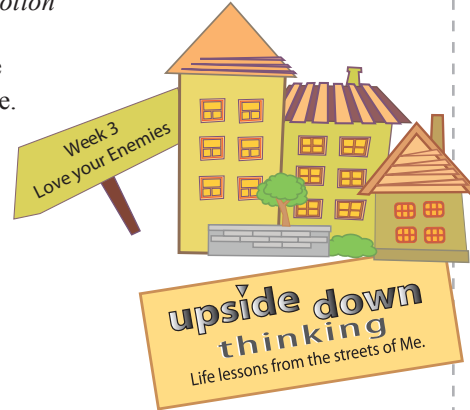
Let’s do a short quiz on loving your enemies. Fill in the blanks and circle the correct answer(s):

If you named one offender and circled at least one offense, you are not alone. After all, life is full of situations that warrant us to love those who have hurt us. The question is not *if* we should love our enemies; the question is *how* to love someone who has hurt you. Isn’t that counterintuitive or upside-down thinking?

Thankfully, scripture is full of real-life examples of loving your enemies. Take for example, David and Saul. Saul purposely set out to destroy David by deceit, slander and murderous plots. And yet, when David was inches away from Saul, he chose not to end his life. When Saul was killed by another man’s sword, David did not rejoice. Instead he honored Saul’s life by providing a statesman-like funeral for the man who had tormented him for years.

Are there people in your life who you need to love and forgive? There is in mine. Romans 5:21 declares: “Don’t let evil conquer you, but conquer evil by doing good.” The only antidote God gives us for evil is love. Any other response does not honor God. After all, hate builds into resentment and bitterness, while love glorifies and reflects God, heals the victim, and could possibly change the offender. It boils down to this—do I allow love or hate to rule my life? God always chooses love and so should I.

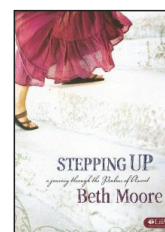

Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. Weekly Bible Reading

Matthew 5:43-48 (NIV)

“You have heard that it was said, ‘Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’ But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your brothers, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.
