The talk of the town

In the next seven weeks, we will study in detail some of the attributes of the men and women who became avid followers of Jesus Christ. This Jesus, who recently underwent a horrendous torture and death and after three days was raised from the dead, was the talk of the town. First-hand accounts of how this man healed the lepers, restored sight to the blind, enabled the lame to walk, eradicated evil spirits lurking in a variety of situations, and fed thousands with only five loaves and two fishes topped the everyday conversations of the weather, family and who's getting married to whom.

Stories of him had been rippling through their culture for years in every imaginable professional and societal class. Even prostitutes and social outcasts talked about him. An entire town became aware of his presence after he talked to a woman at a public well about the private details of her life and the wellspring of water that is available. The entire town was so engaged with his words that they urged him to stay with them longer.

Of course, the town's religious leaders had lots to say about this Jesus. Even though they began to prohibit any public talk about this "King of the Jews," heated debate behind closed doors ensued about how to deal with the man who was hanging out with sinners, not keeping their perceived idea of the law and tradition, and healing people from a multitude of sicknesses and infirmities.

Let's not forget about the disciples who spent hours with Jesus. Their everyday conversations would have revealed the miracles and healings of their "Master and Lord." Dinner table conversations probably revolved around Jesus' teachings concerning the new hierarchy of "the kingdom of heaven." After all, his teachings completely rearranged and eradicated most of their established traditions by simply replacing them with "Love God" and "Love your neighbor." These disciples soon became labeled as "his followers."

But my favorite witness of Jesus was by an unnamed young man who miraculously received sight during an encounter with Jesus. The healing caused quite a ruckus in the community. As the healed man faced the Pharisees, he simply stated "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!"

Personally, I can relate to this blind man, I may not be able to understand every detail of my Lord and Savior, but I do know one thing, I was blind, but now, by God's grace I can see. So before we even study the attributes of these men and women, let's emulate what consumed their everyday lives—Jesus. And let's talk about who he is, what he has accomplished and how he has changed our lives.

Financial Report

God has blessed our congregation with great abundance that we, in the church office, take seriously. We work hard at ensuring that we steward the finances that members of our church freely give. Likewise, we strongly believe that we need to communicate a realistic snapshot of our finances on a quarterly basis; thus, this current fiscal year's third quarter (Q3) and year-to-date report. It is our prayer that it will help members see how their offerings are utilized in the best possible way.

What we look at: When we take a look at the church's finances, we look at the amount of giving, total income and expenses. We then compare them to the following three things:

- The same quarter of the previous year.
- Year-to-date numbers from the previous year.
- The current fiscal year's budgeted numbers.

Third Quarter Giving: As of the end of the current O3, there is a decrease in both giving and total income for the third quarter and year-to-date as compared to last year and to the budgeted amounts.

Actual giving for Q3 of this year fell 7.15 percent from actual giving during the previous year and was 18.43 percent lower than budgeted. In actual dollars, Q3 was \$28,588 behind last year. The shortfall to cover budgeted income was \$83,837.

Due to the fact we had a positive first quarter (Q1) for this fiscal year, the yearto-date giving, compared to last year, is only down 2.18 percent or \$26,235. Comparing the year-to-date giving to the current year budgeted amount, the giving is down 8.60 percent or \$110,691.

Third Quarter Income: Total income, made up of giving, tuition, building usage fees, interest income, and the Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority lease, follows a similar pattern. Since giving makes up most of the total income figure and the trend shows a decline, total income will also be down as other revenue is not enough to offset the shortfall in giving. Total income for Q3 is down 5.59 percent or \$25,149 when compared to last year and Q3 total income is down 16.51 percent or \$84,065 compared to what was budgeted for the current year.

Compared to the previous year, the present year-to-date total income is down .82% (less than 1 percent) or \$10,769 and the year-to-date total income is down 7.72 percent or \$108,862 when compared to what was budgeted for the current year.

Third Quarter Expenses: There is better financial news when the expenses of the church are examined. During the current Q3, expenses were slightly higher than O3 of last year by .33 percent (less than 1 percent) or \$1,547, but significantly lower than the amount budgeted for Q3 for the current fiscal year. The Q3 expenses were 2.51 percent or \$11,953 less than budgeted.

The present year-to-date expenses compared to last year's year-to-date expenses are 2.59 percent or \$34,197 less and the year-to-date expenses are 6.98 percent or \$96,701 less than the budgeted amount.

Summary: Giving and total income are down not only in the Q3 but for the entire year. The fourth quarter financials will be extremely important for the church. Giving and income will need to increase while at the same time expenses will need to be closely monitored to keep them in line in order to meet the church budget.

Under the direction of Kim Phillips and several ministry partners, 63 youth began fasting on Friday for 30 hours. During the fast, they attended a presentation from Drake students, who recently served in Ethiopia, played interactive games about the various tribes in Ethiopia, listened to a homeless man share his life experience, made bracelets to support a Ghana mission project, put together health-care kits to be sent to Haiti and canvassed the Urbandale area for canned goods to be taken to Bethel Mission in Des Moines and the Urbandale Food Pantry.

Funds raised will help feed and care for children in poverty-afflicted countries around the globe and nationally. Chile earthquake relief

Due to the February 27 earthquake and tsunami in Chile, the death toll has reached 800 and an estimated 500,000 homes were destroyed.

Upwards of 2,500 displaced Chileans are living in six-by-eight-foot wooden structures at one government-run refugee camp in the coastal city of Constitucion. In the weeks following the earthquake, the local pastors have gone door-to-door assessing how people are doing and identifying their needs. With fewer than 10 church workers, their manpower is limited. The pastors and church members are providing vital assistance as quickly as they can and ask that the LCMS keep them in prayer.

Materials are readily available in Chile, but members of the local churches are in need of financial assistance to purchase the materials that are needed to assist the individuals impacted by the earthquake and living in refugee camps.
