You Can't Please Everyone

Bringing Jesus Christ to people for the first time and for a lifetime.

A common malady intermittently surfacing in our lives is becoming a people pleaser. Its form sometimes hides by a quick "sure I would love to do this for you." So, we commit without a full examination of the deeper motives lurking in our souls—we said "yes" because we aim to please or we thought a "no" was not a correct Christian response. But somewhere along the way, we realize the pleasing treadmill has adverse consequences because we neglected our primary focus—God.

Am I now trying to win the approval of men, or of God? Or am I trying to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a servant of Christ. Galatians 1:6

Today we will look at the downward spiral of pleasing everyone and compare it to the upward freedom of living solely for God. Let's ponder our true motives: are we doing things for people or for God? And once we understand our motivation, we can readjust our focus to a more heavenly perspective—God's.

Starting Sept. 11-12, we will take an in-depth look at the Ten Commandments. "A Study of 10" will show why God chose that moment in the salvation story to give his commandments and discover how the original audience would have heard the decrees from their God. We will also begin to see how they apply to our current times and show us God's love, inspire us to learn more about his grace and encourage us to live for him in our everyday lives.

Small groups are not a new concept or even a new approach. During the first two centuries of the Christian era, church buildings did not exist. Instead they met in house churches where close relationships flourished, helping them withstand the persecution.

Even though most of us do not face persecution in the middle of the heartland, we do face discouragement, bewilderment and challenges. Wouldn't it be awesome if we had a group of individuals who could pray, give an encouraging word, or advice when we hit those uncomfortable spots on our walk with God? We need each other. And in a large congregation, we need the safety net of a small group that will help us to fully learn how to deal with life's complex issues. So, that is why we are passionate about getting everyone into a small group this fall.

Starting August 28-29 after each worship service, there will be small-group facilitators to talk about the possibilities of joining a small group. When you find a group, you can sign up to be involved in the 8-week small-group study that corresponds with the message series beginning, Sept. 11-12. Each group will meet weekly for approximately 60-90 minutes, build friendships, discuss the message series and how to apply its truths in everyday life, and pray. We hope you will consider joining us this fall and experience what helped the early Christian church—each other.

Executive Director's overview

In the office, we are intentional about overseeing and managing all of the resources that God has blessed us with at Gloria Dei. Below is a summary of the main accomplishments for the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2010:

- In order to have a clearer picture of the financials, a quarter-based accounting procedure was implemented to acknowledge the income and expense fluctuations between periods.
- •• A Financial Control Policy was written and put in place.
- The \$15,027 preschool loan was paid off in February 2010.
- Due diligence was done on the remaining two loans for the church, and we are getting the best possible interest rate at this time.
- Tiny Treasures' budget was folded into the Gloria Dei budget.
- Of the \$1,710,360 total income for the year, \$1,546,773 was from giving.
- Total expenses were \$1,746,570, of which \$75,000 was allocated for future strategic planning.
- Upon review of the church's building, property and worker's compensation insurance policies against other companies for coverage, liability and cost, we are remaining with our current carrier.
- The "L" project, moving the portable walls from the preschool rooms to the "L" section of the building, was completed in June 2010, to establish a children's ministry area.
- Preventative maintenance on the land and building are timed to avoid future large expenditures.
