Transformation

The story of Jesus' transfiguration is familiar to many Christians. In that wonderful vision on the mountain, Peter, James and John had a life-changing experience. What they saw helped them to grasp the Lord's true identity as the Son of God and the promised Messiah. Witnessing this glimpse of his glory gave the three disciples a powerful and intimate bond with Jesus. This bond was critical in sustaining their faith through the coming passion of the Christ. No matter what happened, they could always reflect back to those moments on the mountain and have faith that somehow everything would work out. Today, we will further see how looking at Jesus can have life-changing transformation.

The Prodigal God Message Series

Next week, we begin a six-week look at the three parables in Luke 15 with a special emphasis on what is commonly called the "Parable of the Prodigal Son."

Even though most of us are familiar with this parable, we may need a refresher. Let's look at the parable through the eyes of Nolan Scherer, a 5-year-old boy, who reiterated the story to his mother after hearing it at Tiny Treasures:


There was a dad with two sons and the youngest one of the sons said, "I want all the money that I get for working." The dad gave him the money, so the son left. The dad told the son, "Be wise. Be Smart. Use the money for food and clothes." But the son used it for clothes, candy and parties for his new friends. And all of sudden, his money was all gone and he was hungry. So, he went to a pig farm to get more money, but he was afraid to tell his dad. And then he knew that he needed to go home. When the dad saw the son walking to his house, the dad came outside. When the son finally came to the dad, they both hugged. The dad said, "Welcome home!" He had a big party for the son. The son learned that his dad loved him. He was afraid to come home and tell his dad what he had done, but he did the right thing anyway. And that is the end of the story.

As a church, let's look at Luke 15 through new lenses, similar to those that Nolan used. Perhaps by doing so, we can more vividly see what Jesus intended by these parables. We ask that you begin the journey in prayer and also participate in the following ways:

1. Listen to the weekly message.

- 2. Purchase and read the book "The Prodigal God."
- 3. Participate in a small group. One-page studies will be handed out each week to help you apply the message to your life.
- 4. Talk about the weekly message with your children or grandchildren.

The power of a small group

The following excerpt is from "Courageous Leadership," written by Bill Hybels, senior pastor of Willow Creek church, one of the most attended churches in North America.

I had just finished presenting my weekend message at Willow and I was standing in the bullpen, talking to people. A young married couple approached me, placed a blanketed bundle in my arms, and asked me to pray for their baby. As I asked what the baby's name was, the mother pulled back the blanket that had covered the infant's face. I felt my knees begin to buckle. I thought I was going to faint. Had the father not steadied me I may well have keeled over. In my arms was the most horribly deformed baby I had ever seen. The whole center of her tiny face was caved in. How she kept breathing I will never know.

All I could say was, "Oh my...oh my...oh my."

"Her name is Emily," said the mother. "We've been told she has about six weeks to live," added the father. "We would like you to pray that before she dies, she will know and feel our love."

Barely able to mouth the words, I whispered, "Let's pray." Together we prayed for Emily. Oh, did we pray. As I handed What happens if it isn't a good fit? No worries, we only ask that you try your best to continue in the group for the six weeks. Oftentimes, it takes a few times for the group to synch together. her back to her parents I asked, "Is there anything we can do for you, any way that we as a church can serve you during this time?"

The father responded with words that still amaze me. He said, "Bill, we're okay. Really we are. We've been in a loving small group for years. Our group members knew that this pregnancy had complications. They were at our house the night we learned the news, and they were at the hospital when Emily was delivered. They helped us absorb the reality of the whole thing. They even cleaned our house and fixed our meals when we brought her home. They pray for us constantly and call us several times every day. They are even helping us plan Emily's funeral."

Just then three other couples stepped forward and surrounded Emily and her parents. "We always attend church together as a group," said one of the group members.

Where, I wondered as they left, would that family be, where would they go, how would they handle this heartbreak, without the church? There is nothing like the local church when it's working right. Its beauty is indescribable. Its power is breathtaking. Its potential is unlimited. It comforts the grieving and heals the broken in the context of community.

Following is a MFTH e-mail received from a missionary with Joy In Hope, a non-profit organization dedicated solely to working in Haiti:

"My name is Leann Pye and I am a missionary living in Jacmel, Haiti. In December we were given about 100 boxes of food from your organization. We were planning on using it towards VBS and a soccer tournament we had planned. However, as you know, an earthquake devastated many parts of Haiti. Jacmel is one town that has been hit hard. The road from Jacmel to Portau-Prince is impassible with cars, taptaps, and trucks. There are no supplies coming in and we don't know when the road will be fixed. We have been able to feed hundreds of people daily since the earthquake because of your food. I can't express my gratitude enough. May God bless you and your ministry."



In 2006, Gloria Dei committed to support Yeko Waako, an Ugandan who desired to attend seminary. He was passionate

sister in Christ over there."

Yeko continues, "Life in the seminary is a blessing since you have made my study of theology, which is the primary goal, a possibility but has also been a great challenge in terms of daily needs." Due to his limited source of income, he faces financial hardship to meet basic daily needs. In addition, his visa recently expired and must be renewed.

To renew it, he must submit a medical certificate, police clearance, repatriation and the visa fee itself. His application is made to the South African embassy which is inundated with numerous requests because of the 2010 World Cup.

Yeko has requested additional funds to cover some of the necessary expenses for his last year of seminary. He also inquired about obtaining a used computer to assist him in his final year at seminary and in future ministry assignments.

Since Gloria Dei is committed to being courageous in outreach and we want to support Yeko in his godly pursuits, we have granted all his requests.

Please keep Yeko in your prayers. Life in Uganda is quite a bit different than in America where we have so many luxuries at our fingertips. God is faithful on both continents, so pray for Yeko's family, his final year of seminary, his needs being met and that he continues to see God's mighty hand upon his life and ministry.
