Causes to celebrate

Bringing Jesus Christ to people for the first time and for a lifetime.

Last winter in the "Prodigal God" message series, we concentrated on the three parables found in Luke 15 and learned that each of these parables ended in great rejoicing because something of great value was lost and then found. In fact, in each parable the entire neighborhood was invited to celebrate.

Great celebrations are not a foreign concept to the Bible, nor in our lives. Recently, a story was aired about a boy, Jailen Cooper, from Farmville, North Carolina. At eight years old, he underwent a risky surgery to remove a tumor that was growing on his pituitary gland.

"At first I was kind of scared then I realized God was with me." Jailen said.

Jailen's family rallied around him at his bed side as his face swelled up beyond recognition weeks following the surgery. Slowly, Jailen started to recuperate and celebrated his birthday out of intensive care.

When he came home, Jailen's elation increased when he received a phone call from Tom Cable, coach of the Oakland Raiders, asking if he wanted to play or coach with the team. Jailen quickly responded, "a little bit of both."

A week later, Jailen was on the Raider's football field dressed in full-Raider gear proudly wearing a custom-made "1" jersey. Surrounded by all his Raider heroes, he was able to face his ultimate hero, Darren McFadden, in a one-to-one square-off play. As the entire team quickly jumped sides to cheer on this young rookie, Jailen successfully tackled the 225 pound running back from Oakland, California.

In a news conference after the famous play, Jailen commented that McFadden "might be a little bruised, but I don't think I hurt him that bad."

Great celebrations are still occurring in Jailen's life as he thinks about his recovery and his tackle. How about us? Do we celebrate things in our lives? Or should we? One underlying theme in Jailen's life was in the midst of a great trial, he knew God was with him. And even in his best-case-scenario, tackling McFadden, he knew God was still with him.

The truth is that through all the ups and downs of life, in the valleys and the hills—God is always present. He never leaves us. Period. It is neither the end or the beginning of the story, it is the complete story. He is always with us and that is a cause to celebrate, isn't it?

Helping children and youth discover their God-given talents

In 2004, a ministry was started because of an 18-yearold girl living under a bridge in downtown Des Moines.

Since then, God has grown the ministry to include after-school programming for inner-city youth ages 6-17, transitional housing for homeless young adults ages 18-22, a community food pantry and clothing closet, and even youth centers in rural communities of Iowa. Freedom for Youth Ministries is a shining example of God's plan to rescue our lost and hurting youth. For several years now, Gloria Dei and a host of volunteers have been actively carrying out our commitment to being a Beacon to the Community.

"We couldn't do any of these programs without the body of Christ coming alongside and being the hands and feet to reach our youth," comments Melanie Wise at Freedom for Youth. "Volunteers are vital and have a direct effect on the impact we have in our neighborhoods."

This ministry is a bit different from others. Jesus is the foundation, the leader and the core

of what is taught. The ministry understands their mission can only be accomplished through him and those that demonstrate his love through their actions. Actions such as serving meals, helping with projects, donating items and teaching classes ranging from finance and wood-working to computer programming and auto repair.

"It is rewarding when youth complete their Freedom for Youth experience, become employed and live independent Christ-centered lives," says Gloria Dei member Mo Grotheer who has assisted in several of the youth educa-

tional programs.

Beginning this fall, Gloria Dei will begin its third year of serving dinners to the youngest children and their tutors the first Monday of each month. Dinners are served at 5:30 p.m.

For the medical and/ or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.

This Week's Bible Reading John 2:1-11 (NIV)

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine." "Dear woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied, "My time has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet." They did so, and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now." This, the first of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed in Cana of Galilee. He thus revealed his glory, and his disciples put their faith in him.
