Shhhhh...trying to listen to God

Silence bugs me. I mean it bugs me to the point that I will avoid it at all costs. Perhaps my fear of silence is what causes me to overbook my life. I fill it from sunup to sundown with activities. Nearly all of them are positive, you know, the kind of things that a Christian woman should fill her time with. But my days are packed, leaving little room for rest and even less time to be still with God. Psalm 46:10 says, "Be still and know that I am God." Still. God is always there, but I fail to notice him in the chaos.

Don't get me wrong; I spend time with God. Most of my activities during the day are somehow focused on his Word or on growing his kingdom. I read scripture, pray and tell others about God all day long. After all, I'm a church worker. There's no doubt my days are filled with God, but it's not enough. My days are just too chaotic.

Don't tell anyone, but I'm hard of hearing. I'll deny it to anyone who asks me (let's hope my husband doesn't read this), but there's no doubt that I miss a lot of what's said to me every day. It seems like I have a much more difficult time hearing things when there are a lot of competing noises. I think that's what happens with God, too. He is constantly giving me counsel, encouragement and gentle nudges, but I am so busy sorting through the chaos of my life that I fail to listen to his quiet voice.

This week, we're focusing on meditation. How apropos that I'm the staff person assigned to the topic. Won't you commit with me this week to appreciate silence for what it is and find some quiet time to hear what God has to say to you? I'm confident it will change our lives; time with God always does.




