Listening to God Message Series

Communication is the vital foundation for every healthy relationship. The dialogue of listening and talking among friends builds trust, love and appreciation. As long as the channels of communication are open, friends can get to know each other, share their most trite experiences and even share their deepest secrets and longings. But the key to relationships is for communication lines to remain open.


God desires a relationship with his family. It has been said that Christianity can be defined as a relationship between a Father and his family. The book of Ephesians gives us a vivid picture of the roadblocks that once prevented us from a relationship with God. We were in the worst of scenarios—completely lost and without God. But God wanted to destroy the barrier, so he sent Jesus Christ.

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. Ephesians 2:14-18

Not only are our sins forgiven, but we now have access to the Father. As far as God is concerned, the communication lines are open! From God's vantage point, the table is set, the invitation is sent and he longs for our presence. God is willing and able, all we have to do is be present. And similar to any friendship, a mutual sharing with each other should occur—an intimate time of listening and talking as friends often do.

In the next four weeks, we will embark on a journey that will help us listen to God with more attentive ears. We will listen to the messages about the practice of journaling, meditation, worship and fasting. After each week's worship service, we can further practice the message by spending time in the "Listening to God" experiential space (rooms 135-137) and attending Re:fuel on Friday evenings. This combination will help us to take time out of our busy lives and listen to our Father, who strongly desires to have a relationship with us.



2. Experiential Time







Jeremiah 36:1-7 (NIV)

In the fourth year of Jehoiakim son of Josiah king of Judah, this word came to Jeremiah from the LORD: "Take a scroll and write on it all the words I have spoken to you concerning Israel, Judah and all the other nations from the time I began speaking to you in the reign of Josiah till now. Perhaps when the people of Judah hear about every disaster I plan to inflict on them, each of them will turn from his wicked way; then I will forgive their wickedness and their sin."

So Jeremiah called Baruch son of Neriah, and while Jeremiah dictated all the words the LORD had spoken to him, Baruch wrote them on the scroll. Then Jeremiah told Baruch, "I am restricted; I cannot go to the LORD's temple. So you go to the house of the LORD on a day of fasting and read to the people from the scroll the words of the LORD that you wrote as I dictated. Read them to all the people of Judah who come in from their towns. Perhaps they will bring their petition before the LORD, and each will turn from his wicked ways, for the anger and wrath pronounced against this people by the LORD are great."
