Mother and Daughter Team Help Ugandans Article by Karen Kennedy, Photos by Emily Raecker

Life can sometimes take on a radical direction through a simple invitation by someone closest to you.

Emily Raecker, a 19-year-old Drake student and member of Gloria Dei, invited her mother, Martha, to accompany her on a trip to Uganda in January. The trip was led by two Drake professors, who are working with a group of Drake students to build a medical clinic in Kikandwa, a rural village about an hour drive from Uganda's capital, Kampala.

"When your 19-year-old invites you anywhere, you clear your schedule and go," says Martha.

Since one of the professors was originally from Uganda, they had "an insider's view" to the Ugandan culture. They spent most of the week viewing different medical clinics, making

connections with the villagers, local businesses and the Rotary Club and even went on a safari.

Emily also spent some time with a local artist, Godfrey Kalungi, whom she met last summer when she traveled to Uganda to help local entrepreneurs. As part of a three-week college course and with the help of Shining City

Foundation, she arranged a \$1,500 micro-finance loan for Godfrey to sell his vibrant-color batik prints and to develop a business strategy that would help him make enough money to support his four younger siblings.

"I was amazed at all his progress since I was there. He even has one employee," says Emily. "It's amazing to see how my little efforts caused a huge impact in his life. He's living his dream and it is so exciting!"

Martha was also intrigued by the culture with its "very friendly people, who are laid back and not run by the clock." And since many locals speak English, Martha appreciated their desire to get to know her by asking her name and repeating it often to make sure they were pronouncing it correctly.

But what she really fell in love with were the children. "They were just simply adorable," Martha says.

Of course, visiting a church was on the itinerary. As they traveled to Kikandwa to visit the future site of the medical clinic and to attend church, they noticed men, women and children walking, beautifully dressed, and headed for church.

Although the church was in the native Ugandan language, Martha recognized two familiar hymns, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus," and "This is the Day." Through the support of Shining City, Emily and Martha were able to present the church with Bibles, hymnals and financial support to repair the church's roof.

After church, the entire team was invited to the professor's father's house where some local women prepared a huge lunch, took the table and chairs outside, and covered the food with dishcloths before serving them lunch.

"It reminded me of what lunch would have been like at my Grandma's house many years ago," says Martha.

But with all the full range of experiences in Uganda, Martha says seeing her daughter helping others was one of the most precious gems of the entire trip.

"At the end of my days, I will still be talking about the trip that I was able to take with Em," says Martha. "We did it together!"
