One-to-one ministry by a trained, caring friend

Recently, we commissioned the second wave of Stephen Ministers, which brings a total of 23 Stephen Ministers who can walk alongside those who are experiencing challenging times.

Since 1975, Stephen Ministry has provided more than 10,000 congregations with the structure, training and resources to set up and administer a complete system for one-to-one Christian care through a Stephen Minister.

Stephen Ministers usually serve for two years, which includes an initial 50 hours of training followed by twice-monthly supervision and continuing education sessions. Typically, they are assigned one care receiver at a time to meet with for about one hour each week.

They minister to those who are experiencing:

Loneliness

Loss of a spouse

Retirement changes

Unemployment

Discouragement

Childbirth

Hospitalization

Divorce

Grief

Terminal Illness

Being shut-in

Recap of 30-Hour Famine

In April, 59 youth became more aware of some of the hardships of the poor during the 30-Hour Famine. The group collected \$12,450, which will be matched ten times by a government grant; thus amounting to an additional \$124,500 for World Vision. Following is a recap of the weekend's events told by Kim Phillips, leader of the famine:

This year was no technology famine. Every electronic game in the Youth Center was unplugged as well as a challenge issued to not use cell phones. The country we specifically learned about was Ethiopia, Africa.

Friday night: The youth broke into Ethiopian tribes and everyone took on the identity of a child who lives there; some children had disabilities. Then three Drake students shared information about their mission trip to Ethiopia, which further helped us to understand the pangs of being a child in Ethiopia. We then saw a video presentation and ended the session with worship and prayer. We ended the evening by traveling to Sportsplex West on chartered buses with Majestic Bus Lines.

Saturday: We broke into three groups to put together health care kits that will be sent to Haiti; to make bracelets for a Ghana, Africa fundraiser; and to assemble 200 sack lunches for Joppa Outreach of Des Moines. Joe Stevens, founder of Joppa, and Michelle, a homeless woman, talked with our teens about the life of the homeless. Next, we broke into twelve groups and canvassed the Urbandale area for canned goods. We delivered 700 items to Bethel Mission of Des Moines (shelter for the homeless) via Majestic Bus Lines. Hundreds of other items collected were delivered to the Urbandale Food Pantry. We returned to church for the 5:30 p.m. Northwind worship service before breaking our fast with a buffet.





Weekly Bible Reading: Acts 6:1-7 (NIV)

In those days when the number of disciples was increasing, the Grecian Jews among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. So the Twelve gathered all the disciples together and said, "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. Brothers, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word."

This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

So the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith.
