Urbandale Food Pantry

Since the Urbandale Food Pantry opened its doors two years ago, they have more than doubled the number of families who receive a once-a-month supply of food. Last month, they gave food to 223 families or 620 people. In addition, the number of individuals using the pantry on a daily basis to receive fresh bread and produce has increased dramatically. The

rapid growth has caused them to move into a larger office, three doors down from their current location at 7611 Douglas Ave.

"We care for people from all walks of life," says Eileen Boggess, Urbandale Food Pantry Coordinator. Clients range from professional couples who have recently lost their jobs to refugees from Africa, Eastern Europe, Russia and Vietnam.

"You get to know and appreciate these people," says Eileen as she gave a hearty welcome to a familiar face that entered the pantry last Monday. Eileen explains that this woman came in for food

while undergoing chemotherapy. "It's great to see her rebound."

As Eileen showed the new location, which is still under construction, she was especially excited to show the area where families will check in and then sit comfortably in a waiting room until their food package is ready. The new location will also have ample room for the more than 70 volunteers who work 150 hours per month by talking with the clients, assembling food packages and organizing the donations on the shelves.

"Since Gloria Dei has been instrumental in supporting the Food Pantry since its beginning and continues to support it along with other congregations," says Pastor Burcham, "I want to further support their move by challenging us to collect enough funds to purchase a commercial freezer and refrigerator for about \$2,500. I feel confident we will meet this need."

This Week's Bible Reading Exodus 20:1-11 (NIV)

And God spoke all these words: "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me.

You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand {generations} of those who love me and keep my commandments.

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. Communion

For the medical and/ or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine. In addition, gluten-free wafers are available, please alert the elders before the service if possible.
