Responding to Tribulation

It doesn't take long in life to face Jesus' words in John head on:

I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. to people for the first time In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. John 16:33

> Trials, tribulations and transitions make no friends as they knock at our doors unexpectedly and enter into our houses causing chaos with everything and everyone in their path. Oftentimes, their visit can be felt years after their surprise stopover. "Why did it happen to me?" "Where were you Lord when they stumbled into my life?" "Why didn't you stop them?" "Why is life so unfair?"

Let's face it, we will have trouble because we live in a fallen world. But let's look at a few examples* of people who have faced harsh circumstances and how they fared through the adversity:

This child was born in Port Huron, Michigan with an estimated IQ of 81. He had withdrawn from school after three months and was considered backward by school officials. The child enrolled two years late due to scarlet fever and respiratory infections, and he was going deaf. His emotional health was poor. He was stubborn and aloof, showing very little emotion. Who was he? Thomas Edison, reputedly the greatest inventor of modern times.

By the age of 10, both of his parents had died. He was raised reluctantly by an older brother who resented another mouth to feed. His wife died after 13 years of marriage. Eventually, he went blind and was paralyzed with a stroke. Who was he? Johann Sebastian Bach.

He dropped out of grade school and was home schooled. He ran a country store but went broke and it took 19 years to pay off all his bills. He was married, but his marriage flopped. His wife came down with mental illness and paranoia. He had a son who was physically weak and died at a young age. He ran for political office four times, twice for the house and twice for the senate, and lost all four times. Ultimately, he held office but was despised by half the country. Satirists and newsmen derided him on an almost daily basis. Most audiences felt his speeches were hum-drum. His classic speech was met with indifference. Who was he? Abraham Lincoln.

Each of these men faced dreadful situations and yet they did not allow the circumstances to control them. How about us? How can we better equip ourselves to have peace when everything else turns to turmoil? Today, we will learn how to prepare ourselves with the ultimate reality of who is in charge of our house when the uninvited guests arrive.

Helping children and youth discover their God-given talents

In 2004, a ministry was started because of an 18-yearold girl living under a bridge in downtown Des Moines.

Since then, God has grown the ministry to include after-school programming for inner-city youth ages 6-17, transitional housing for homeless young adults ages 18-22, a community food pantry and clothing closet, and even youth centers in rural communities of Iowa. Freedom for Youth Ministries is a shining example of God's plan to rescue our lost and hurting youth. For several years now, Gloria Dei and a host of volunteers have been actively carrying out our commitment to being a Beacon to the Community.

"We couldn't do any of these programs without the body of Christ coming alongside and being the hands and feet to reach our youth," comments Melanie Wise at Freedom for Youth. "Volunteers are vital and have a direct affect on the impact we have in our neighborhoods."

This ministry is a bit different from others. Jesus is the foundation, the leader and the core

of what is taught. The ministry understands its mission can only be accomplished through him and those that demonstrate his love through their actions. Actions such as serving meals, helping with projects, donating items and teaching classes ranging from finance and wood-working to computer programming and auto repair.

"It is rewarding when youth complete their Freedom for Youth experience, become employed and live independent Christ-centered lives," says Gloria Dei member Mo Grotheer who has assisted in several of the youth educa-

tional programs.

Beginning this fall, Gloria Dei will begin its third year of serving dinners to the youngest children and their tutors the first Monday of each month. Dinners are served at 5:30 p.m.
