Stephen Ministers Commissioning

We are excited to commission 16 individuals from our congregation to be Stephen Ministers at the 9 and 10:30 a.m. services in the Sanctuary. Together they have received extensive Stephen Ministry training for the purpose of helping those who are experiencing a difficult situation in life.

"I am excited to have a great group of people who have dedicated their time and gifts to help others," said Pastor Phillips, Director of Congregational Care and Associate Pastor. "I am confident that many will be blessed through their work."

Stephen Ministry is a not-for-profit, trans denominational, religious and educational organization founded in 1975. The St. Louis-based staff of 45 includes five pastors. The organization is in more than 10,000 congregations representing 150 Christian denominations in all 50 states and 25 countries. More than 500,000 people have been trained as Stephen Ministers. Consequently, more than a million people have received care from a Stephen Minister in a formal one-to-one caring relationship and millions of others have received care from Stephen Ministers in informal ways.

In 2008, Pastor Phillips formed a Ministry Action Team to discuss how to provide more care for hurting people. Stephen Ministry surfaced because of its extensive training program and success in other congregations. Last April and May, candidates from Gloria Dei were interviewed and recruited to be involved with this ministry. A few months later, training began in a series of 18 sessions. Each 2.5 hour training session focused on how to help people navigate through various circumstances. Trained as Stephen Leaders, Pastor Phillips, Fred Spath and Janet Tysse provided training and ongoing oversight of the ministers.

"I am excited because I believe the Stephen Ministers will improve and strengthen our Congregational Care Ministry at Gloria," said Pastor Phillips.

In the next few months, a second wave of Stephen Ministers will be recruited and trained with the goal of another commissioning in April 2010.



Weekly Bible Reading: Ephesians 2:13-22

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ.
