Ablaze Heats Up

Join us today as we embark on phase II of Ablaze, Refueling the Fire. We will spend the next four weeks looking at faith-building elements. Often when we start living out our faith, it requires change on our part; therefore, the sermon series will concentrate on areas that may need change:

Change of Expectations, April 22 and 23

What do we think the life of a Christian should look like? Our expectations may differ from what the scriptures declare. For example, sometimes we believe that as long as we are faithful, God will bless us and nothing will go wrong. In reality, Christians are not exempt from trials and tempations because we live in a fallen world; however, we can expect God to be at our side during every moment of our lives.

"...for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." Deuteronomy 31:6 b

Change of Attitude, April 29 and 30: Scripture says that we are to have the same attitude as Jesus. What was Jesus' attitude and how can we adopt it?

Change of Habits, May 6 and 7: Habits have a way of shaping who we are and what we do. Are our habits helping our faith and testing it?



Change of Community, May 13 and 14: What influence do our friends have on us?

Age-Appropriate Curriculum

The children, youth and adults will follow the sermon series with curriculum made especially for them to help incorporate the truths into their everyday life. After worship, ask your child if they learned any "hot" truths today.

Small groups are an integral part of Ablaze. "Coming together in small groups is a God-centered and God-directed ministry. The Bible from beginning to end has in its understanding that people need to be part of a community in order to grow," said Pastor Meyer, Director of Adult Ministry. "It is out of this very nature and purpose that we are encouraged to form small groups. Just as God lives in community, Father, Son and Holy Spirit,

we are created in his image and can demonstrate who God is through gathering in small groups. "
