Light Heats Up Change

This week's Ablaze topic, "Change of Attitude," is a familiar charge at our house. I often tell my children to change their attitude. Likewise, I find myself repeating those words when facing an undesirable task. Unfortunately, my attitude would rather stay stuck than be changed.

Jesus dealt with unchanging attitudes when dealing with our old impetuous friend Peter. Previously, Jesus had taught the disciples by words and deeds the importance of the hierarchy of heavenly values, i.e., serving trumps selfish gains. But like us, Peter needed real-life examples. As the story unfolds in John 13, Jesus confronted Peter's attitude by performing a servant's task of washing his feet.

When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. John 13:12-15

Servanthood, Jesus style, is not celebrated in our daily world. The world clings to the "me" attitude—it is all about me and not my neighbor. For example, how many times have we raced to get the closest parking spot, completely ignoring the other car?

And yet Jesus left an example that we should follow, which eradicates the world's selfishness. He also leaves a promise about what we will become as we follow his example:

Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them. John 13:17




