### **Current Sermon Series:**

### **Starting the Conversation**

by Pastor Kendall Meyer

Today concludes the sermon series, "Starting the Conversation." We have explored the religions of Scientology, Church of Latter Day Saints, Buddhism and now today, Islam. We have learned that people believe in things contrary to God's Word. However, in light of their beliefs, we need to loving respect and engage them in a conversation. In other words, we need to love them with the love that has been given to us by Christ.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16 NIV

Now that doesn't mean that respecting and engaging them in conversation shows that we somehow approve of their beliefs. It doesn't mean that we are sending a message to others that what they believe is acceptable. It does mean that we are willing to meet people where they are in their lives and start a conversation that could lead them to where they need to be.

That's exactly what Jesus did. Max Lucado, when describing Jesus and his presence here on earth says it best when he states that the tax collectors and prostitutes didn't run away from Jesus, instead they ran toward Jesus. Jesus wants us to be comfortable enough in who we are in him, that we can boldly proclaim what he has done for all people. We do that by conversing, building relationships, and genuinely caring for those who are walking a different path; not by being stand-offish, uncaring, or uninviting. Paul himself says it best when he states:

I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some. 1 Corinthians 9:22

So, let's start the conversation, whether the person is a Scientologist, Mormon, Buddhist or Muslim, so that we may win some for the Gospel.

### The Basic Core Beliefs of Muslim (Islam)

In an effort to understand the Islam religion and its impact on today's society, we have composed a summary of their basic beliefs.

#### History

An individual who believes in and consciously follows Islam is called a Muslim. Islam is a monotheistic Abrahamic religion originating with the teachings of the prophet Muhammad.

#### **Central Belief**

Muslims believe that God revealed the Qur'an to Muhammad, God's final prophet, and consider the Qur'an to be the literal word of God. It is the central religious text of Islam. Islam means acceptance of and submission to God, and believers must demonstrate this by worshipping him, following his commands, and avoiding polytheism. Although Muslims believe that Jesus was a prophet, they reject the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, comparing it to polytheism.

### **Belief in Deity**

Allah is the proper name for Almighty God. Muslims believe that since Allah alone is the Creator, it is he alone that deserves our devout love and worship. The basic beliefs of Muslims fall into six main categories, known as the Articles of Faith, which consist of faith in the unity of God, in angels, in prophets, in books of revelation, in an afterlife, and in destiny/divine decree.

### Concept of Sin

In Islam, faith and good works go hand-in-hand. A mere verbal declaration of faith is not enough, for belief in Allah makes obedience to him a duty. A person commits a sin if he knowingly goes against the law of God or against his own fundamental goodness.

A sin is a conscious and willful action that violates a commandment of God or the right of a fellow being.

#### **Salvation**

Muslims believe that the Day of Resurrection is preordained by God but unknown to man. The Muslim doctrine of salvation is unbelievers and sinners will be condemned, but genuine repentance results in Allah's forgiveness and entrance into Paradise upon death.

### **Religious Practice**

A mosque is a place of worship for Muslims. Although the primary purpose of the mosque is to serve as a place of prayer, it is also important to the Muslim community as a place to meet and study. Muslims consider everything they do in life to be an act of worship, if it is done according to Allah's guidance. There are five formal acts of worship which help strengthen a Muslim's faith and obedience. They are often called the Five Pillars of Islam, which consist of testimony of faith, prayer, almsgiving, fasting and pilgrimage.

#### After Death

The Qur'an emphasizes bodily resurrection and states that resurrection will be followed by the gathering of mankind, culminating in their judgment by God. If Muslims are genuinely repentant and seek the forgiveness of God, they will be pardoned and so there is no question of their suffering an eternal and tormenting punishment in hell.

### Who and where are Honduras' poor rural people?

The country's poor rural people include farmers, rural women, landless people and laborers, some of whom belong to ethnic and indigenous groups.

Women and indigenous groups are among the poorest people in Honduras. Women who are heads of households make up about 9 percent of the country's small farmers. They work long hours and bear the double burden of working the land and taking care of their families, in which there are an average of seven children. The income of households headed by women in hillside areas is about 30 percent less than that of households headed by men, and they receive less than half the level of government transfers. As many as 70 percent of rural women are illiterate, and only 20 percent have had secondary level schooling.

Honduras has nine recognized indigenous and African American minority groups comprising about 70,000 families, or about 6.5 percent of the population. Communities of indigenous origin include small subsistence farmers and temporary rural workers. Many of them are landless. Indigenous peoples have substantially higher poverty rates. An estimated 71 percent of indigenous people live below the poverty line.

Poverty is prevalent in central hillside areas in the interior highlands of Honduras, which are home to about 75 percent of the rural population, including indigenous groups. The highest concentration of rural poverty is found in the western region, which also has the greatest concentration of extreme poverty.

### Why are they poor?

Lack of access to land, together with fragile social conditions, a vulnerable environment and low agricultural productivity are among the problems at the root of poverty in the country.

The country is prone to hurricanes and flooding, particularly in the areas close to the Caribbean coast. Hurricane Mitch, which hit Honduras in late 1998, caused widespread destruction of basic economic and social infrastructure, rural housing and food crops.
