God's Conversions of Failures

Today, we will examine Paul's life as we continue to investigate the "Famous Failures" of the Bible.

We first meet Saul (who later is named Paul) in Acts 8 when "he agreed completely" with the killing of a man named Stephen who spoke boldly about Jesus Christ. In Philippians 3, we gain more insight into this Saul of Tarsus. His lineage, training and obedience to the Jewish law were impressive. In fact, he even admits that he was a "real Hebrew if there ever was one!" His mission in life was to protect the true faith of his forefathers, so it is not surprising new Christians were on his personal hit list.

So Saul continued to spearhead a house-to-house hunt to throw men and women into prison. Christians avoided him knowing that Saul had the power to kill or destroy them or their loved ones. By all Christian standards, Saul's life was in total opposition to God. After all, he destroyed the people whom God highly valued-the church, the body of believers who believed in his Son. The church's situation was grim-no litigation committees or advocates were on the horizon to help tame or control this beastly man, named Saul.

But Saul's life soon became a remarkable example of the redemptive power of Jesus Christ when his "killing the Church" agenda was interrupted by a bolt of light and an unexpected voice:

"Saul, Saul, Why are you persecuting me?"

"Who are you, lord?" Saul asked.

And the voice replied, "I am Jesus, the one you are persecuting! Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." Acts 9:4b-6

In the verses that follow we see how God changes a ruthless killer into a chosen "instrument" to take God's message to the Gentiles, to the kings, as well as to the people of Israel.

As we are aware, Paul not only became the leader of the first century church, but wrote thirteen letters that we use daily to understand the very Lord that Paul persecuted. And to think these letters were written by the hands that once killed.

As we look around at those we meet, do we see people who, by all practical purposes, have no hope of recovering from their failures or mistakes? Are their sins so unforgivable and unredeemable? If it weren't for the God I know, I would say yes, but the God I know, who revealed himself to Paul, says no. God can and will redeem individuals for his glory to build his church. What will God do with the failures of those around us? How about our own failures?


Reveal/Spiritual Life Survey

We begin the first step in fulfilling one of our ministry initiatives from the Strategic Plan—to formulate personal spiritual development plans. In October, all adults (18 years and older), who regularly attend the church, will be asked to take the online, anonymous and confidential survey that will help us understand what we can do to help foster spiritual growth.

The survey was first developed and tested by Willow Creek Community Church in Barrington, Ill. Although the Willow Creek's attendance and membership was steadily increasing throughout the years, they wanted to assess the spiritual growth and needs of their very large congregation. In other words, they wanted to find out if members who were involved in the church were actually growing in their faith. And so they developed a unique research method, now known as the Reveal Survey, officially known as the Spiritual Life Survey, which utilizes state-of-the art research to capture spiritual behaviors, attitudes, beliefs and felt-needs of churchgoers in a completely confidential way. The survey moves beyond reviewing the standard membership numbers and starts to look at the unseen elements of spiritual growth, such as how individual's spiritual attitudes, needs and motivations align with spiritual behaviors, and what activities and experiences catalyze growth. More details of the survey will follow in the upcoming weeks.





Weekly Bible Reading: Acts 9:1-6; 19-22

Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem. As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." After taking some food, he regained his strength. Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God. All those who heard him were aston-ished and asked, "Isn't he the man who raised havoc in Jerusalem among those who call on this name? And hasn't he come here to take them as prisoners to the chief priests?" Yet Saul grew more and more powerful and baffled the Jews living in Damascus by proving that Jesus is the Christ.
