Our community



The Strategic Planning Ministry Action Team has been researching studies on our community to understand the past and future trends. According to all indicators, the section of Urbandale inside the interstate loop is projected to grow 10.5 percent in the next five years and the section west of the interstate is slated for a 39.4 percent growth rate. Urbandale's growth is on a similar upward trend with neighboring cities, such as Waukee at 30.2 percent, Grimes at 12.8 percent and Johnston at 23.3 percent.

Other studies of the Urbandale vicinity have reported that the average age is mid-to-late 30s, with a median income from \$65,000 to \$100,000 and has 2 1/2 -3 children per family.

Research also showed that 25,000 people in the Urbandale, Grimes, Clive, Waukee area do not have a church home. When questioned about the qualities they wanted in a church, 39 percent stated that connections with members were paramount, 30 percent wanted a clear belief statement, 29 percent looked for worship style with relevant sermons, and 25 percent wanted convenience.

Even more interesting is why they returned to a church: 45 percent returned due to worship style, 35 percent returned because of a clear belief statement, 25 percent

returned because of the connections and another 25 percent returned because of convenience.

When asked about the most desirable characteristic of a church, 44 percent of the survey reported family focus was vital and 43 percent indicated the importance of sermons on current and practical issues.

(Please note that respondents could choose up to three factors in each of the above questions; thus, the total percent amount equals more than 100.)

As we plan for the future, it is imperative to evaluate the current and future trends of the community that we live in. In doing so, we will reach more people with the good news of Jesus Christ.

China update


For the next several weeks, there will be an opportunity to stop in the narthex between services to hear about the work in China and Tibet.

Please take a moment to stop and see pictures of the Christian church, which was built in a remote mountain village with funds from Gloria Dei. The opportunity to build this church was made possible with more than five years of humanitarian support in the region. The Gospel has been brought to life through enhanced living conditions, educational opportunities, and medical and dental clinics.

Partnering with the Shining City Foundation (SCF), we continue to support priority needs in the area. In September, several members of Gloria Dei had the opportunity to establish a relationship with the Lucky Star Orphanage School in Lhasa, Tibet. There are about 50 children in this school, who continue to need basic necessities such as bedding and food provisions. A mattress and quilt for a child can be provided for \$20, and a week-long supply of rice, wheat, and cooking oil for all 50 students costs only \$50. There is no

administrative cost involved, so every dollar contributed goes to project support.

For every contribution of \$20 to support the current needs of the Lucky Star Orphanage, a 14-month calendar that showcases the spectacular beauty of remote China will be given out. The photos are by our lead contact in the area, who is also an award-winning photographer.





Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level, access is through the doors in the Narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Cry room

Located in the southeast corner of the Narthex is a room for parents to take their small children to when they are upset or crying. This room allows full view of the Sanctuary and has full audio to hear the service.

Families worship together

With the exception of the 7:45 a.m. service, the first 20 minutes of each worship service is designed for families to worship together. At that point in the service, children and youth will be invited to join their peers in an educational time specifically for them as outlined below.

Grace Place - preschool and elementary children

We offer Grace Place, our weekend educational time, for children ages 3 to fifth grade at three different times: Saturday from 5:50-6:30 p.m.; Sunday from 9:20-10 a.m.; and Sunday from 10:50-11:30 a.m. Children will be invited from worship to attend Grace Place. They will gather outside of worship and leaders will escort them to their classrooms.

Castaway - youth

For our junior high youth in grades 6-8, we have a high-energy educational time, Castaway, in the Youth Center on Sundays at 9:20 and 10:50 a.m.

Senior high and adults

Our senior high youth in grades 9-12 are invited to a study on Sundays from 9-10 a.m. in rooms 134-38.

Adults are invited to join us for an in-depth journey using materials from the Lifelight series in rooms 131-33 from 9:20-10:20 a.m., or a study that parallels the new sermon series from 10:20-11:20 a.m. in rooms 135-37.

Communion

Communion is offered on the first and third Sundays of each month during the services in the Sanctuary and the second and fourth Saturdays during the services in the Family Life Center.
