The Magi Looked Upward

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him." Matthew 2:1-2

For such a short scriptural entrance into the Christmas story, these Magi have caused centuries of conjectures as scholars have debated the details of their lives. Tradition tells us these three men traveled on camels across the desert, silhouetted against the navy-blue sky wearing large decorative hats. Many scholars suggest these wise men were from a priestly order that paid particular attention to the stars and were knowledgeable in the Old Testament scriptures, such as Numbers 24:17:

"I see him, but not now; I behold him, but not near: A star will come out of Jacob; a scepter will rise out of Israel. He will crush the foreheads of Moab, the skulls of all the sons of Sheth."

Whatever the exact details of the Magi's lives, we do know that they looked upward, which spurred them to travel to a distant land and worship an unknown child.

"Where are you going?"

"Not sure, just saw a star and have a strong inkling that we better follow it. We may regret it if we don't."

"How long will you be gone?"

"Not sure."

"Need a map?"

"No, we are only looking upward, that will lead us to where we need to go."

Sounds like an illogical, not-well-thought-out plan. Yet doesn't the journey of faith have those characteristics? Aren't we supposed to look upward, look unto something larger than ourselves and walk accordingly? After all, men and women in the scriptures walked into an unknown future, holding onto the compass of God's light. It only took a promise, a visible sign like a burning bush, an angel, or God speaking to them directly and they were on their way. The list is long. For example, Abraham packed up his belongings and left Ur; Peter left his fishing business and followed Jesus; and Mary took a complete risk by responding with, "May it be to me as you have said." And the Magi saw a star, left normalcy and journeyed toward their real treasures, which were seen in the heavens.

As you know, the story gets better. After a short detour with King Herod, the Magi continued to follow the star until they reached their final destination: Jesus Christ. They were overjoyed, bowed down, worshiped him and presented him with gifts.

The Magi's original hope was fulfilled in finding Christ. Certainly this encounter was forever etched into their minds and hearts.

"How was your trip?"

"Almost unbelievable; our eyes actually saw the Messiah."

"How did you get front-row seats?"

"I am not sure; we just followed the light."

We too have the awesome privilege of looking upward from the darkness of our night or circumstances to find our Savior, who is the light and hope in this world.

Enjoy the light of this Christmas season.

will travel approximately 26 hours to Kampala, the capital of Uganda, which is approximately 85 percent more populated than Des Moines. Kampala, built on seven hills, has all modern necessities (minus the good coffee places) of Des Moines.

The team will stay in several houses within the city as they prepare for the three-day worship conference starting Wednesday, Jan.

3, for 34 Ugandan congregations.

"Our goal is to assist the Lutheran congregations to develop a blended format for worship, so that they can reach their neighbors and friends with the relevant and contemporary message of Jesus Christ," said Steve Kohtz, Director of Worship Ministry.

On Friday, Pastor Burcham, Senior Pastor, will be teaching the lay leaders and the two pastors on how to construct messages that relate to their culture.

"I want to teach tools and techniques of sermon building that will translate into their culture, so that ultimately lives are changed," said Pastor Burcham. "Although the gospel message remains the same, the applications need to be relevant to their culture and not ours. It needs to be practical with real-life applications."




New Life Ministry Action Team
